ABOUT THE PAPER, PART 4: 1996 - 2002

The goal of this paper/project is to provide a background regarding the growth of the sport of volleyball in Ohio, to record major information about volleyball and the OHSAA, and to record major information of the OHSVCA. It will be presented during the summers of 2004 through 2008, the OHSVCA's 25th anniversary.

It will also give coaches/schools access to the history of their school in volleyball in terms of state honors, all-star matches, and state tournament results. If anyone knows of a former coach that coached in the early years of the sport, please let that person know this paper is available on line. Junior high/ middle school and boys' volleyball information will be kept to a bare minimum as my primary interest and concern is with girls' high school volleyball.

A great amount of the information listed below came from a paper I wrote in 1990-1992 while obtaining my masters degree. Many different sources were used to gather this information including the following:

- Interviews of different individuals around the state concerning volleyball; people interviewed included: Charlotte Basnett (first OHSVCA Executive Secretary), Chuck Braden (New Knoxville), Lucille Burkett (Shaker Heights, DGWS Chair), Hildred Byrkett (Troy), Chuck Dorsey (Jackson), Rod Ebright (Grandview Heights & Sports Imports), Dorothy Edwards (Elida), Diana Ford (Bexley), Lois Harkins (Federal Hocking), Randy Heath (Jackson Journal Herald), Margaret "Peg" Love (Department of Education), Bob MacFarland (Stow), Carol Mertler (Ashland College), Radonna Miller (Upper Arlington), Dr. Deborah Moore (OHSAA), "Bernie" Reinhardt (Lima Shawnee), Char Sharp (Archbold), Agnes Timmons (Barnesville), Dr. Jo Ann Tyler (Otterbein College), and Lori Wagner (Mansfield). If you know of someone I should interview, please let me know! I interviewed Sue Brady of Oberlin High School & Kathleen Harris of West Holmes High School the summer of 2005. Coach Brady started teaching in 1958 at Oberlin and began the girls' athletic programs at that school. Coach Harris began the girls' athletic program at West Holmes in the 60's as well. It was a complete ioy to listen to their memories!!!

- ♣ My own files, which included information about the Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee, the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association including the OHSVCA newsletters, planners, and All-Star programs, District 5 Volleyball Coaches Association All-Star Match programs, the National Federation rule books, and bulletins from the OHSAA office
- ♣ The national office of the National Association for Girls' & Women in Sports and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance for rule books, and other pieces of pertinent information
- ♣ Donated material from various individuals such as Diana Ford, Margaret Love, Chuck Braden, and Anita Jorney-Gifford
- ♣ Additional help from the OHSAA office and Brandy Young in providing the results of the state tournaments during the '90s

A BRIEF REVIEW OF THE YEAR OF 1996

- ❖ Officers (second person listed normally took office at the August Clinic): President Sonny Lewis, Holland Springfield; Vice-President −Tom Kohl, Piqua; Vice-President/All-Star Match − Cathie Kindler, Shelby; Vice-President/Clinic Bob Price, Westerville South; Recording Secretary Carol Russo, Elyria; Treasurer Carolyn Rammel, St. Mary's; Cathy Berry, Continental; Executive Secretary- Laura Smith, Frankfort Adena

- ❖ Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1996 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA were \$15.00, lifetime fee was \$150.00
 - Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
 - o In April, we had 905 members with 308 of those being lifetime members; the lifetime membership fee was raised from \$75.00 to \$150.00 and the clinic fee was raised as well
 - The OHSAA did not approve our request for a two day regional tournament; in 1996,
 Ohio would serve anywhere from behind the endline as well as rotate on every sideout; junior high teams and coaches appreciated the 7' net for play
 - OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 2nd, and Saturday, August 3rd; main speaker would be Fran Ralston Flory of the University of Kentucky; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; 590 coaches attended the clinic!
 - O In the ninth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) over 120 schools received a certificate of their accomplishment; team winners were: Division I- Bowling Green, 3.683; Division II- Centennial, 3.677; Division III- Lakota, 3.628; Division IV- Newark Catholic, 3.723; in the ninth year for the scholar athlete award: 492 athletes received the honor and 113 scholar/athletes earned a 4.000 gpa!
 - o 1996 Summer Olympics were being held in Atlanta, Georgia
 - Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
 - Chuck Braden requested that the OHSVCA consider buying a scantron for poll voting and All-Ohio voting with the coaches voting on computer scan sheets; concerns were raised about the cost, time and programming difficulties for this method
 - O Grace Hutchinson reported that the sixth annual Elite Camp was full and would once again be held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace was looking for high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp
 - Boys' Volleyball had 65 schools registered with the OHSAA; State Tournament & All-Star Match was held in May at St. John's Arena at OSU; USA Volleyball made a

- proposal to take over Boys' Volleyball in the state (was discussed by Bill Cooperrider and Bob Price)
- Elite Camp Coordinator, Grace Hutchinson, wrote an article for the September newsletter discussing the tremendous success of the sixth annual Elite Camp
- Cathie Kindler announced that Ohio Northern would host the 1996 All-Star Match on Sunday, November 17^{th;} eighty of Ohio's best senior players would participate in four divisional matches with play beginning at 1:30 pm at the King Horn Center in Ada
- As always, coaches were still encouraged to call scores in using the code-a-phone number (since 1983!)
- Scholarship winners for 1995-96 were: Division I Carrie Barnes, East Liverpool HS;
 Division II Christina Riggilo, Miami Trace HS; Division III Pamela Moore, Lisbon
 David Anderson HS; Division IV Erica Bowman, Covington HS; winners received
 \$300
- Pam Witzmann was our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA; she was required to attend three
 meetings per year to the OHSAA & report to the OHSVCA on matters pertaining to the
 SEI; the 1996 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Susan Thomas of Rossford High
 School
- The OHSVCA nominated Coach Char Sharp of Archbold as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach
 of the Year" to the NFICA; this made her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- O 1996 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, directors, and coordinators as well as news about boys volleyball
- Concerns were raised once again about the quality of officiating; a committee of officers and district directors were to meet in August at the OHSAA office with a group of officials
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- o In 1996, the coaches would give a voice vote at the sectional seeding meeting

- The OHSAA tournaments used one of four different volleyballs which would rotate divisions each year (in '96- Baden (IV), Mikasa (I), Spalding (II), Tachikara (III)
- Fred Durkle, state tournament manager at the Nutter Center, had passed away and Peggy Wynkoop would resume duties as such; the state tournament program carried an article about Mr. Durkle
- o Coach of the Year awards were once again presented at the state tournament
- Only one player was ejected from a match in Ohio this year; there were 15 reports of unsportsmanlike conduct
- Dr. Moore started a four year term as chairperson of the National Rules Committee in volleyball
- Laura Smith reported at the November meeting we had 964 members with 320 lifetime members; there was no treasurer's report as of November as new treasurer Cathy Berry had not received information from Carolyn Rammel
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district directors about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; proposals to the OHSAA were: 2 day regional tournament, not counting a blood substitution as a substitution, starters not counting as an entry, allow one additional scrimmage for teams advancing from District tournaments, and allow 22 on the pass list at the regional and state level
- Bob Price announced that the 1997 clinic would be held on August 1 and 2; the drill book for the clinic would be the "Best of the Best" edition; a Schedule/Planner was to be given at the clinic
- Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award
- The OHSVCA sponsored a Hospitality Room once again at the state tourney with help from our sponsor, Spalding
- Chuck Braden proposed a \$300.00 scholarship be awarded to an active member's son or daughter; motion passed
- OHSVCA Media Award winners for 1996 were Mark Sonka of the Chillicothe Gazette,
 Dave McMillan of the Ross County Advertiser, and Mike Smith of WBEX-WKKJ Radio
- 1996 Hall of Fame inductee was Sue Brady of Oberlin!

- O At the November Board meeting, Bill Cooperrider voiced opposition to USA Volleyball becoming involved in the administrative duties of boys' volleyball; the OHSVCA was concerned with the lack of growth in the number of teams registering with the OHSAA over the last five years; it was decided for the OHSVCA to establish an executive board with USA Volleyball; board members were Sonny Lewis, Bob Price, and Bill Cooperrider
- Coaches Char Sharp (Archbold) and Bob MacFarland (Stow) hit the 500 plateau for wins by varsity coaches!
- o In the December newsletter, President Sonny Lewis reminded coaches of two important out of season sports regulations: 1- you or your high school staff may not coach any of your high school players until June 1st (same for junior high coaches and players); 2- no more than 3 players from the same school may be on the same roster
- The December Newsletter carried information concerning Boys' Volleyball which included some of the following facts: it was a spring sport, it was regulated under the OHSAA (not recognized), the OHSVCA handled the regular and state championship, matches could be 3 out of 5 and could use rally scoring; the state tournament was to be played at St. John Arena on Friday, May 16, and Saturday, May 17, 1997
- Cleveland State hosted the Women's NCAA Volleyball Championships in December and OSU would host the Men's NCAA Volleyball Championships in May ('97)

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1997 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - o Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA remained at \$15.00, lifetime fee was \$150.00
 - Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith

- The division numbers for 1997 were: Division IV- 1-133; Division III-134-223;
 Division II-224-396; Division I- 397-1700
- o In April, we had 966 members with 320 of those being lifetime members
- The OHSAA did not approve our request for a two day regional tournament in 1997; the principals and athletic directors did vote for it, but the OHSAA Board off Control said NO
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 1st, and Saturday, August 2nd; main speaker would be Linda Grensing of Duke University; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; cost of the clinic was \$75.00 and the Saturday only registration was removed as an option; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; the drill book for the clinic would be the "Best of the Best" edition; a Schedule/Planner was to be given at the clinic
- O In the tenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 32 schools qualified; team winners were: Division I- Mother of Mercy, 3.818; Division II- Shelby, 3.778; Division III- Coldwater, 3.807; Division IV- St. Henry, 3.559; in the tenth year for the scholar athlete award: 464 athletes received the honor and 103 scholar/athletes earned a 4.000 gpa!
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- In April of '97, Chuck Braden presented the proposed state championship ring from Josten's; coaches would receive if they were members of the OHSVCA beginning with the 1996-97 school year
- o In April, Grace Hutchinson reported that the seventh annual Elite Camp was full and would once again be held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace was looking for high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting
- O Boys' Volleyball State Tournament & All-Star Match was held May 16 & 17, at St. John's Arena at OSU; 68 teams played in the four regions; Bill Coopperrider organized an administrative council to oversee and advise boys volleyball; members were Bernard Witzmann, Centerville; Tom Mercer, Troy; Kip Witcney, Dublin Coffman; Patrick Cunningham, Springfield; and Mary Howard, Akron Hoban; the OHSVCA wanted boys volleyball to establish 16 directors and to mirror the OHSVCA

- Cathie Kindler announced that Ohio Northern would host the 1997 All-Star Match on Sunday, November 16th; eighty of Ohio's best senior players would participate in four divisional matches with play beginning at 1:30 pm at the King Horn Center in Ada
- Ohio was going to continue to experiment with allowing 2 hits on the first contact (no setting action); 10 rule revisions would be in place for 1997-98
- The OHSAA asked the OHSVCA to recommend one ball to be the approved state ball
- o The code-a-phone number was not in service this year (only year since 1983)
- Scholarship winners for 1996-97 were: Division I Jessica Price, Westerville South HS;
 Division II Brynn Denny, West Branch HS; Division III Christina Comstock,
 Frankfort Adena HS; Division IV Katie Rheinheimer, Central Christian HS; winners received \$300; decision had been made to table a scholarship for OHSVCA members' children
- Tom Kohl was to revise the Scholarship form to require a guidance counselor's signature and to list Volleyball Awards/Honors
- Pam Witzmann, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 1997 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Carolyn M. Balis of Cuyahoga Heights High School
- The OHSVCA selected Coach Julie Thoman Perry of Cincinnati St. Ursula as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this made her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year; Char Sharp of Archbold was named the Section 2 NFICA Coach of the Year
- 1997 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, directors, and coordinators as well as news about junior high and boys volleyball
- o an amendment was made to our constitution to state that associate members could not hold the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, and recording secretary
- Chuck Braden retired as the Awards/Poll Coordinator; Tom Kohl took over the Awards and Cathie Kindler took over the Polls
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-

- Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- o The OHSAA tournaments used one of four different volleyballs which would rotate divisions each year (in '97- Baden (III), Mikasa (IV), Spalding (I), Tachikara (II)
- o Peggy Wynkoop continued as State Tournament manager at the Nutter center
- o Coach of the Year awards were once again presented at the state tournament
- There were NO players ejected from a match in Ohio this year, but there were 5 coaches ejected
- Or. Moore would be in charge of assigning officials to the regional and state tournaments in '98 with the results from the coaches turning in their officials' rating sheet
- Laura Smith reported at the November meeting we had nearly 1000 members with over 300 lifetime members; new treasurer Cathy Berry had not received all the back statements & cancelled checks from Carolyn Rammel making the transition for the new treasurer difficult with an audit coming up
- OHSVCA agreed to purchase for '98 poll
- Mike Riffee did a comprehensive evaluation of the '97 clinic with ratings on a 5 point scale; overall rating for the clinic was a 4.2; clinic would remain in August; total cost of the clinic for the OHSVCA was nearly \$10,000
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district directors about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; proposals to the OHSAA were: 2 day regional tournament, every time out be 60 seconds regardless, allow one additional scrimmage for teams advancing from District tournaments, blood related substitutions do not count as a entry, and adopt the HAIA unlimited substitution rule
- Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award
- The OHSVCA sponsored a Hospitality Room once again at the state tourney with help from our sponsor, Spalding
- 1997 Hall of Fame inductees were Diana Ford, Girls Volleyball Advisory
 Committee; Judy Gregory, Columbiana Crestview; and Mary Howard, Akron Hoban!

- Boys Volleyball would start in March ('98), the season would last 8 weeks, and follow
 the same rules and regulations for girls; State Tourney would be held May 15-16 at OSU;
 Glynda Rice was concerned about the lack of communication from the advisory board to
 the directors, since most information was coming from the OHSVCA newsletters
- In the December newsletter, President Sonny Lewis reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and Individual Scholastic Awards
- o Treasurer's report for the end of December showed \$31,134.72 in all of our accounts

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1998 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA stayed at \$15.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00
 - Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
 - o The division numbers for 1998 were: Division IV- 1-134; Division III-135-227;

- Division II-228-394; Division I- 395-999
- In April, we had nearly 1000 members and our account showed \$28,000+; in August we moved \$10,000 to a CD
- The OHSAA did not approve our request for a two day regional tournament in 1998 (AGAIN), but the principals and athletic directors did once again vote for it, but the OHSAA Board of Control said NO giving absolutely no reason for their vote
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 7th, and Saturday, August 8th; main speaker would be Greg Giovanazzi of the University of Michigan (what were we thinking- Michigan?!); Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; cost of the clinic was \$75.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; a drill book and a Schedule/Planner was to be given at the clinic; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic
- The OHSAA selected the Spalding ball as the official ball for all OHSAA sponsored tournaments
- o In the eleventh year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 35 schools qualified; teams with the highest gpa were: Division I-Lebanon, 3.790; Division II- Shelby, 3.767; Division III- Versailles, 3.709; Division IV-Colonel Crawford, 3.713; in the tenth year for the scholar athlete award: 402 athletes received the honor and 126 scholar/athletes earned a 4.000 gpa!
- The OHSVCA voted to establish a website; Bill Buirley & Tom Sizer of Fairmont
 HS and his Web Management Class would post daily scores, the weekly poll and the
 All-Ohio results (unfortunately, this did not work out due to problems at Fairmont HS)
- o The 1998 All-Star Match was moving to Wooster HS, November 22
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- o In April, Grace Hutchinson reported that the eighth annual Elite Camp was full and would once again be held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace was looking for high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting; Grace reported in August that she felt the camp could be self-supporting after sharing financial breakdowns with us from 1991-1998

- Boys' Volleyball State Tournament & All-Star Match was held May 29 & 30, at St.
 John's Arena at OSU; 65 teams played in the four regions; the OHSVCA sponsored the tournament; Bill Cooperrider promised a financial statement in November
- In 1998, the National Federation said no to blocking or attacking a serve, no incidental contact with the net, no back row blocker, and no multiple contact on the first contact of serve
- Scholarship winners for 1997-98 were: Division I Ashlie Case, Austintown-Fitch HS;
 Division II Amanda Zapko, Canfield HS; Division III Brandi Stover, Parkway HS;
 Division IV Sarah Smith, New Bremen HS; winners received \$300
- Pam Witzmann, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 1998 SEI
 Award winner for volleyball was Agnes Timmons of Barnesville High School
- The OHSVCA selected Coach Julie Thoman Perry of Cincinnati St. Ursula as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this makes her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- 1998 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, directors, and coordinators as well as news about junior high and boys volleyball
- Discussion was on about a "Lifetime Achievement Award" to recognize coaches who would not qualify for the Hall of Fame
- Ohio would participate in a Penn-Ohio All-Star match with the OHSVCA Executive
 Committee and Grace Hutchinson (Elite Camp) selecting the players and coaches
- o Glynda Rice reported that boys volleyball was showing better organization and direction
- The OHSAA was starting a new section in the "Athlete" magazine call "FAQ" frequently asked questions
- Coaches failing to return their officials ballot at the sectional seed meeting would be fined \$100.00
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"

- State qualifiers met in Columbus instead of the Nutter Center making it easier on the
 OHSAA and the state qualifiers (travel time)
- o Max Benton took over the duties of tournament host at the Nutter Center
- o Coach of the Year awards were once again presented at the state tournament
- There were NO players ejected from a match in Ohio this year, but there were 7 coaches ejected
- Or. Moore stated that letters complaining or reporting someone or something had to be signed for it to be responded to by the OHSAA; there were some problems with the Spalding ball; the OHSAA was looking at classes to become a volleyball official (remember the old DGWS system?), and there was going to be a national survey concerning rally scoring
- Laura Smith reported at the November meeting we had 994 members with over 300 lifetime members; new treasurer Cathy Berry was doing an excellent job preparing the treasurer's report
- o Jayne Kingler was looking into her computer class helping with the website in the future
- Cathie Kindler felt a new fax machine would aid in the poll voting being more timely and asked for a raise in pay; OHSVCA agreed to both
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district directors about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; proposals to the OHSAA were: 2 day regional tournament, unlimited substitutions with a 15 team limit, and every time out would be 60 seconds regardless of who called the time-out
- Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award
- The OHSVCA sponsored a Hospitality Room once again at the state tourney with help from our sponsor, Spalding; membership cards needed to enter

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1999 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA stayed at \$15.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00
 - Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
 - The division numbers for 1999 were: Division IV- 1-131; Division III-132-222;
 Division II-223-392; Division I- 393 and up

- In April, we had nearly 1000 members and Cathy Berry was moving part of our money into CDs; our total assests had risen to \$55,000
- The OHSAA did not approve our request for a two day regional tournament in 1999
 (AGAIN & AGAIN) even with the principals and athletic directors once again and again voting for it; volleyball remained the only sport to have to play 2 contests in one day to win the regional
- The OHSAA did decide to make a single date for the start of the season for 1999-Monday, August 9th, and starting in the school year 2000-2001, adult education would be mandatory for all new volleyball and soccer officials (Dr. Moore and Henry Zaborniak were instrumental in this new program becoming a reality); in 2000, officials would have to wear a white polo shirt (replacing the black and white stripes)
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 6th, and Saturday, August 7th; main speaker would be Teri Clemens of Washington University of St. Louis; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; cost of the clinic was \$75.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; a drill book and a Schedule/Planner was to be given at the clinic; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district directors were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; we were having difficulty with Spalding honoring all aspects of their contract; Laura Smith once again sent a flyer to all the high schools and junior high schools in Ohio about the clinic
- o In the twelfth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 53 schools qualified; the scholar athlete award: 472 athletes received the honor and 156 scholar/athletes earned a 4.000 gpa!
- The OHSVCA website was being handled by Jayne Klingel; scores by division could be reported, schedules could be posted
- The 1999 All-Star Match would once again be held at Wooster HS, November 21; Wooster was doing an excellent job hosting this event and planned on adding a hospitality room for officials and coaches
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Once again, Grace Hutchinson reported that the ninth annual Elite Camp was full and would once again be held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace was

- looking for high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting; the camp would be self-supporting; pins were given to the participants instead of t-shirts
- O Boys' Volleyball State Tournament & All-Star Match was held May 29 & 30, at Dublin Scioto HS & Ohio Dominican College; 68 teams were registered for the year; the OHSVCA sponsored the tournament; the boys would compete in an Ohio/Indiana Boys All Star Match; USA Volleyball was going to have a fall season for boys this year; Bill Cooperrider verbally told us there was \$317 available for boys volleyball after expenses
- Discussion was held on designing Hall of Fame rings which could be purchased by the person(s) selected for the Hall of Fame
- Scholarship winners for 1998-99 were: Division I Rae Melek, Austintown-Fitch HS;
 Division II Katherine Kahlenberg, Eastwood HS; Division III Kacy Stevens,
 Archbold HS; Division IV Amanda Henschen, McComb HS; winners received \$300
- o Pam Witzmann, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 1999 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Nancy Hanger of Clyde High School
- Archbold's Char Sharp was announced as a finalist for the NHSACA National Coach of the Year
- o Carol Russo recommended we join the NHSACA on a yearly basis and it was approved
- The OHSVCA selected Char Sharp of Archbold as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this makes her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- 1999 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, and 500 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, directors, and coordinators as well as news about junior high and boys volleyball
- o The "Lifetime Achievement Award" criteria was set and would be available in 2000
- Ohio participated in a Penn-Ohio All-Star match at Juanita College in Pennsylvania;
 travel time was extreme; Ohio would host in 2000
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"

- State qualifiers once again met in Columbus instead of the Nutter Center making it easier on the OHSAA and the state qualifiers in terms of travel time
- o Max Benton once again was the tournament host at the Nutter Center
- o Coach of the Year awards were once again presented at the state tournament
- o There were nine unsportsmanlike conduct reports in Ohio in '99
- There would be a "train the trainers" curriculum to assist the adult education class teachers
- We were continuing to have problems with Spalding not honoring their contract, Dr.
 Moore was going to assist us with this matter
- Laura Smith reported at the November meeting we had 836 members with 350 lifetime members; treasurer Cathy Berry was doing an excellent job preparing the treasurer's report; Cathie Kindler reported problems with coaches sending in cover letters with their All-Ohio nominations
- o Awards Coordinator became a paid position as well as Coordinator of the website
- O Coaches were to contact officers or their district directors about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; **proposals to the OHSAA were**: 2 day regional tournament, and one more scrimmage; proposals to the National Federation were: all time outs 60 seconds, to have unlimited individual substitution with a team limit of 18, and that a substitution for blood not count as an entry
- Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award
- The OHSVCA once again sponsored a Hospitality Room at the state tourney;
 membership cards were needed to enter
- Coaches were requesting more advanced sessions in both the high school and junior high areas; 2000 clinic would offer a shoulder bag with strap and the agenda/planner
- 1999 Hall of Fame inductee was Don Conser of Salem HS! There is a plaque in the
 OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees
- Boys volleyball was doing better, but there was still discussion about a USA proposal to assist in its growth
- In the December newsletter, President Sonny Lewis reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and

Individual Scholastic Awards; also listed was Elite Camp news, minutes of the November meeting, All-Ohio teams, final polls, and All-Star Match teams; Tracy was going to need to buy new certificates for 2000 (Y2K!)

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2000 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA stayed at \$15.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00

- Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
- The division numbers for 2000 were: Division IV- 1-130; Division III-131-223;
 Division II-224-382; Division I- 383 and up
- O In April, treasurer Cathy Berry proposed a bank card be arranged for the OHSVCA; this would pay for hotel rooms and meals for the officers only when conducting association business; this would allow for a 'paper trail' for the treasurer and association to further our accountability; the proposal was approved for each officer to have a card; total money in our account was \$61,000+
- After checking with other State Associations, it was also decided in April to pay the Clinic Coordinator \$1000.00 and the All-Star Match Coordinator/Site Mananger \$150.00; it was also decided to reimburse officers and coordinators for attendance at all executive board meetings and official committee meetings called for the purpose of conducting association business with prior approval of the executive committee
- Executive Secretary Laura Smith reported we had 1060 members in April!!
- FINALLY! The OHSAA did approve our request for a two day regional tournament in 2000! They also granted 5 scrimmages and a preview
- The National Federation decided the following for volleyball in 2000: multiple contacts permitted on the first contact (no finger action) and Ohio would experiment with unlimited individual entries with a team limit of 18 substitutes (new scorebook necessary)
- Adult education was mandatory for all new volleyball and soccer officials (Dr. Moore and Henry Zaborniak were instrumental in this new program becoming a reality); in 2000, officials would have to wear a white polo shirt (replacing the black and white stripes)
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 4th, and Saturday, August 5th; main speaker would be Cecile Reynaud of Florida State University; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; cost of the clinic was \$75.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; a drill book, shoulder bag with strap, and a Planner was to be given at the clinic; coaches were going to receive more advanced sessions in both levels; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district directors were responsible to get

- a \$25 door prize for the clinic; Laura Smith once again sent a flyer to all the high schools and junior high schools in Ohio about the clinic
- o In the thirteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 51 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic; the scholar athlete award: 591 athletes received the honor
- The 2000 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Jill Bouton of Highland High School! Her award would be given to her at the August clinic
- Spalding was no longer our sponsor due to many different problems; the OHSAA was looking at a different ball for tournaments since there were many issues with their balllike holding air
- The OHSVCA decided to raise the scholarship award to \$500.00 and to add a fifth scholarship for an OHSVCA member's son/daughter- the new scholarship would start in 2001
- We were looking into buying a display case to be housed at the Nutter Center to honor our Association; District 15 would be the curator
- After a decade as our president, Sonny Lewis 'retired' to become our past-president as that position was re-instated in August, 2000
- The OHSVCA website was being handled by Jayne Klingel; scores by division could be reported, schedules could be posted, the top twenty would be posted
- The OHSVCA decided to begin getting matching polo shirts to make it easy to identify them at the various association events
- The 2000 All-Star Match would once again be held at Wooster HS, with a change in the format- it would be a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday and the matches on Sunday; Anita Jorney –Gifford was once again in charge; players would receive an All-Star sweatshirt to commemorate their play in the match
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Once again, Grace Hutchinson reported that the tenth annual Elite Camp was full and would once again be held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace was looking for high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting; the

- camp would be self-supporting; pins were given to the participants instead of t-shirts; a session on college recruiting was added to the camp with great success
- Boys' Volleyball State Tournament & All-Star Match was held May 27 & 28, at Dublin Scioto HS & Ohio Dominican College; 68 teams were registered for the year; the OHSVCA sponsored the tournament; the boys would compete in an Ohio/Indiana Boys All Star Match; USA Volleyball was helping with the growth and support of boys in volleyball; John Pugh represented Bill Cooperrider at the August meeting and presented us with a treasurer's report showing a zero balance; Cincinnati Elder was the state champion; due to various concerns expressed by the regional directors, Monte Moser was appointed as the interim boys volleyball coordinator
- Tom Kohl suggested we purchase our trademark logo and Rich Woodman began the process of obtaining a trademark lawyer
- Scholarship winners for 1999-2000 were: Division I Erin Perry, Athens HS; Division II Cecilia Reeder, PurcellMarion HS; Division III Angie Elser, Springfield
 Northwestern HS; Division IV Melissa Kerr, Wellsville HS; winners received \$500.00
- Dan Smith, our interim SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2000 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Lorna Miller of West Holmes High School; her plaque was given at the clinic
- The OHSVCA selected Dave Rinehart of Hopewell-Loudon as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this makes him eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- There were 688 people at the 2000 clinic and our membership was 1027; by November, we had 1093 members (367 lifetime)
- Cathy Berry had been working with an attorney to clarify our tax exempt status and set up our bank accounts; we were in the process of 'incorporating' before Cathy retired as our treasurer; Cathy received a Cross pen/pencil set for her hard work and dedication to the OHSVCA
- 2000 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, and 500 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, directors, and coordinators as well as news about junior high and boys volleyball

- Ohio was to participate in a Penn-Ohio All-Star match at Lordstown High School in Lordstown, Ohio on June 17th; Pennsylvania could not field a team, match was off
- It was decided in August to purchase laptops, an airport, and a portable printer for the officers to take to meetings to help with retrieving information off discs as needed
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- There were two unsportsmanlike conduct reports in Ohio in 2000; Diane Plas would run the "training the trainers" class for '01; the OHSAA implemented a new "transfer rule" – any student that open enrolled after their freshmen year would be denied participation in athletics for one calendar year
- Concerns were brought up at the November meeting about the All-Star Weekend (added expense for spending a night for some, parents committing to 2 days to chaperone, and scheduling problems with basketball scrimmages for participants; discussion occurred with a reminder about making it a quality experience for the All-Star and an honor for the participants; it was also brought up about other sports taking 2 days to run their All-Star weekends)
- O Coaches were to contact officers or their district directors about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; **proposals to the OHSAA were**: to keep the 2 day regional tournament, to increase the number of players in uniform on the bench to 15, and to allow 18 total substitutions per game with no individual limit; **proposals to the**National Federation were: to make all time outs 60 seconds, and to add "instruction to players' to Rule 12, Section 2, Article 5 of the rule book (would allow coaches to stand at the bench to instruct players)
- O Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact Netter; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well and the rules interpretation session was a huge success

- The OHSVCA once again sponsored a Hospitality Room at the state tourney;
 membership cards were needed to enter; Final Four pins were given out during the
 captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament; pins were also
 given out to the umpires and referees of the matches
- 2000 Hall of Fame inductees were Anita Jorney-Gifford of Wooster HS and Dave Rinehart of Hopewell-Loudon HS! There is a plaque in the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees
- Judy Gregory of Columbiana Crestview earned her 500 wins award and Char Sharp earned her 600th win!
- Poll Coordinator's salary was raised to \$750.00; Rich Woodman continued to work on the patent for our logo; OHSVCA was officially incorporated
- By November, the relationship with the OHSVCA and boys' volleyball had moved to the point that the OHSVCA voted to disassociate itself with the program
- o In the December newsletter, President Carol Russo thanked Wooster HS and Anita Jorney-Gifford for an excellent All-Star Weekend and for Jane Kingel's work on the OHSVCA website; she reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and Individual Scholastic Awards; also listed was Elite Camp news, minutes of the November meeting, All-Ohio teams, final polls, and All-Star Match teams
- The OHSVCA was going with Baden as our sponsor; the ball for 2001 would be the Baden Lexum 15-0

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2001 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA stayed at \$15.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00
 - Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
 - The division numbers for 2001 were: Division IV- 1-133; Division III-134-220;
 Division II-221-388; Division I- 389 and up
 - In April, the constitution needed to be revisited with language changes due to our
 'incorporated' status (district directors were to be called district trustees); a clarification

- for the Lifetime Achievement Award needed to be made so that coaches understood this award was for individuals that would not be a candidate for the Hall of Fame, but had devoted his/her career to promoting the sport of volleyball; our checking account showed \$43,000+ while two CDs valued \$32,500+
- The OHSAA kept the two day regional tournament format for 2001! It was a tremendous success for players, coaches, fans, and financially for the OHSAA of course, we knew this! We were also going to be allowed to dress 15 players for tournament play
- The National Federation decided the following for volleyball in 2001: unlimited individual entries with a team limit of 18 substitutes
- The OHSAA was planning on having rules interpretation meetings every other year with 2001 to be an off year; there was still going to be a rules interpretation meeting at the clinic & scorebooks and rulebooks would be made available (the decision to not have a rules interpretation meeting every year did not last); the OHSAA was also planning on phasing out sending their "Athlete" magazine to officials
- o Dr. Moore informed us the Spalding ball would be used in 2001 for tournaments
- OMSVCA at the April meeting; it was going to be made available at the clinic in August
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at Westerville South HS on Friday, August 3rd, and Saturday, August 4th; main speakers would be Chuck Erbe, Michigan State University, and Mike Lessinger, Ohio University; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials; OHSVCA apparel would be available for purchase and ordering; cost of the clinic was \$75.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; OVR coaches would be receiving information about the clinic; a drill book, the Planner, and a two-toned zippered clipboard would be given; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic (we had 21 at the clinic); all district directors were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; Laura Smith once again sent a flyer to all the high schools and junior high schools in Ohio about the clinic
- o In the fourteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 62 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic; the scholar athlete award: 737 athletes received their certificate of honor
- The 2001 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Ed Stewart of Williamsburg
 High School! His award would be given to him at the August clinic

- Cathy Ames was trying to get information on past All-Ohio teams updated and corrected;
 she needed the assistance of all coaches in the state to take the time to pick up their
 packets at the state clinic; she included a history update in the October newsletter
- Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him by July 13th in order to have these awards ready for the clinic
- As always, Cathi Kindler requested that anyone interested in being a poll voter to contact her or his/her district director with his/her name and other info; Cathi always encouraged coaches to be involved in the polls
- The OHSVCA website was being handled by Jayne Klingel; scores by division would be reported, schedules would be posted, the top twenty would be posted; top 20 schools were expected to post their scores (through e-mail only)
- Bunny Brooks would work with Wright State about our display case for OHSVCA memorabila
- The 2001 All-Star Match Weekend would once again be held at Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 17) and the matches on Sunday (November 18); Anita Jorney –Gifford was once again in charge; there were many positive comments from the 2000 event
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Grace Hutchinson reported that the eleventh annual Elite Camp was one of the best camps held for the 84 participants; it was held at Ohio Northern University in July; as always, Grace needed high school coaches to be 'gofers' at the camp; those days did count as contact days if you had a player at the camp; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting; the camp was self-supporting; pins were given to the participants; a session on college recruiting was a great success especially with 30+ college coaches in attendance; a CD was being made on the camp and Bill Feldman of Midwest Scouting Report said the Elite Camp was the only true Elite Camp in the country- way to go Grace!
- o Mantel clocks were given to coaches that hit 400 wins milestones
- o Rich Woodman secured Faye, Sharpe, Fagan, Minnish, and McKee LLP firm to obtain our patent for our trademark; the process was going to take six months or more
- Our incorporated status was not confirmed by the clinic date because the IRS had lost our file; we re-submitted with the help of a lawyer

- Scholarship winners for 2000-2001 were: Division I Ashley Richmond, Milford HS;
 Division II Carolyn Highes, PurcellMarion HS; Division III Courtney Tisher, Rittman
 HS; Division IV Kelly Ruffer, Stryker HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winner was
 Ryan Lewis, son of Sonny Lewis, Holland Springfield; winners received \$500.00
- O Due to questions by Chuck Braden, it was discovered the OHSVCA was lacking an insurance policy for various activities; a new policy was secured that covered the clinic, liability coverage for the Elite Camp, any All-Star Match held between certain dates, and the State All-Star Match; also, every District Trustee needed to have all participants in any district or state All-Star Matches fill out the OHSVCA medical expense responsibility form
- John Matune, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2001 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Mark Williams of Pandora-Gilboa High School; his plaque was given to him at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- The OHSVCA selected Donna Mechley of Cincinnati Mt. Notre Dame as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this makes her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- There were 718 people at the 2001 clinic (most ever!) and our membership was 1108; our checking account balance was \$57,000+ and we had \$44,000+ in our savings account and CD <u>prior</u> to the clinic expenses; by November, we had 1179 members (380 lifetime)
- 2001 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball
- o The Penn-Ohio All-Star Match would probably not take place due to difficulties by Penn
- Tournament info for 2001 was to be found on the OHSAA website and the OHSAA had extra scorebooks due to the change in marking the 18 subs; printed in the September "ATHLETE" were state volleyball records covering kills, blocks, aces, and assists (season, career, match) as well as team wins, consecutive wins, most wins by a team and by a coach

- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- There were three unsportsmanlike conduct reports in Ohio in 2001; volleyball had the highest return of officials ballots (98.9%) to the OHSAA
- O Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; **proposals to the OHSAA/National Federation were**: for regional qualifying teams to be able to pre-sale regional tournament tickets with the standard OHSAA bonus being given to those schools, to be able to stand up for instruction from the bench to instruct players, and that time-outs last the entire 60 seconds even if the team who called the time out comes out of the time out early
- O Annette Neighbarger reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact Netter; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well and the rules interpretation session was a huge success
- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the Nutter Center and Baden; membership cards were needed to enter; Final Four pins were given out during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- 2001 Hall of Fame inductees were Cathy Seipel Ames of River View HS, Nadine
 Wilson of Madeira HS, and Dr. Elizabeth (Bea) Zicha of Muskingum College! There
 is a plaque in the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees
- Jayne Klingel made changes to the website for the 2002 season: voting instructions
 would be included, four people would be in charge of web postings (one per division)
- Melissa Dawson was the new Baden representative
- Kaye Keller reported we finally had official tax exempt status (thanks to Cathy Berry for her work on this issue)
- Changes were made to the Executive Committee (president, vice-president, treasurer, recording secretary, and 3 district trustees elected from the 17 district trustees; the

- Executive Committee would function as the Personnel Committee (to interview candidates for open subcontracted positions and coordinator positions, and to conduct biennial job evaluations)
- The OHSVCA voted to have a Winter Work Session to discuss OHSVCA business and suggest improvements/changes for volleyball
- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- In the December newsletter, President Carol Russo thanked Wooster HS and Anita Jorney-Gifford for an excellent All-Star Weekend which received rave reviews from parents and college coaches; Cathie Kindler and Jane Kingel's also received kudos for their work on the OHSVCA poll and website; changes were made for future polls to allow more time for voting and a change in the ballot forms to emphasize OHSVCA rules being followed; Carol also reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and Individual Scholastic Awards; also listed was Elite Camp news, minutes of the November meeting, All-Ohio teams, final polls, and All-Star Match teams

- **❖** Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2002 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA stayed at \$15.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00; at the November meeting the Board voted to increase the dues in 2003 to \$25.00 and to increase the lifetime dues to \$200.00 in 2004 (the increase was voted in due to increase

- size on All-Ohio plaques-teams 1 & 2- more final four pins, the website, All-Star Match & Banquet, larger and more scholarships, etc.)
- o Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
- The division numbers for 2002 were: Division IV- 1-132; Division III-133-218;
 Division II-219-387; Division I- 388 and up
- In April, plans were discussed for the 20th anniversary of the OHSVCA in 2003; it was decided to have a banquet for this celebration; motion was made and passed to have an annual banquet on each Friday night of the clinic to recognize OHSVCA coaches; it was decided to give two coach's son/daughter scholarships; **Mike Seibert was hired as our official webmaster;** the Winter Work Session was a success with much association business completed; if coaches were interested in being a poll voter, they were to contact Cathie Kindler; if interested in being a 'gofer' for the Elite Camp, contact Grace Hutchinson
- The OHSAA/National Federation decided the following for volleyball in 2002: presale regional tickets, all time outs would be 60 seconds unless both teams were ready to resume play,; NFSH was making their push for all states to play 3 out 5, rally scoring- Ohio voted against it and the OHSVCA supported this decision; Federation would not approve coaches standing to instruct
- o The Baden Lexum 15-0 ball would be the official ball of the OHSAA and OHSVCA
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville NORTH HS</u> on Friday, August 2nd, and Saturday, August 3rd; main speakers would be Robert Patrick, Tennessee, and Keylor Chan, Northwestern University; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; OHSVCA apparel would be available for purchase and ordering; cost of the clinic was \$75.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; OVR coaches would be receiving information about the clinic; a drill book, the Planner, and a coaching bag would be given; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic (we had 21 at the clinic); all district directors were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; Laura Smith once again sent a flyer to all the high schools and junior high schools in Ohio about the clinic
- Coaches were to keep track of how long their matches were lasting (LOM) to assist us in making a decision on going to 3 out of 5 game format, rally scoring

- All forms, association information, etc. was going to be made available on our website;
 the All-Ohio form reminded coaches not to attach anything to the form and not to include pictures
- o In the fifteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 69 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic; the scholar athlete award: over 700 athletes received a certificate of honor
- The 2002 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Ron Lehman of Big Walnut
 High School! His award would be given to him at the August clinic
- Cathy Ames was trying to get information on past All-Ohio teams updated and corrected;
 she needed the assistance of all coaches in the state to take the time to fill out the missing information (she still would appreciate it!)
- Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him by July 15th in order to have these awards ready for the clinic
- The 2002 All-Star Match Weekend would once again be held at Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 16) and the matches on Sunday (November 17); Anita Jorney –Gifford was once again in charge
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- O Grace Hutchinson reported that the twelfth annual Elite Camp was one of the best camps held for the 84 participants; it was held at Ohio Northern University in July; Mark Prince of Tri-Valley was assisting; the camp was self-supporting; pins were given to the participants; a session on college recruiting was a great success
- o Rich Woodman was close to obtaining a patent for our trademark
- Scholarship winners for 2001-2002 were: Division I Kristin Pearson, Ursuline
 Academy; Division II Laura Divoky, Southeast HS; Division III Amy Harbolt, River
 Valley HS; Division IV Jennifer Coletta, Arlington HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter
 winners were Jennifer Flower, Twinsburg HS, and Nick Russo, Elyria HS; winners
 received \$500.00
- John Matune, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2002 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Kaye Keller of Lima Shawnee High School; her plaque was given to her at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet

- The OHSVCA re-nominated Donna Mechley of Cincinnati Mt. Notre Dame as the "Ohio Volleyball Coach of the Year" to the NFICA; this made her eligible for the NFICA Coach of the Year
- Total attendance at the 2002 clinic was 742 (most ever!); our membership was at a total of 1182 (by November)
- 2002 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball
- Tournament info for 2002 was to be found on the OHSAA website; printed in the September "ATHLETE" were state volleyball records covering kills, blocks, aces, and assists (season, career, match) as well as team wins, consecutive wins, most wins by a team and by a coach
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- There were eight unsportsmanlike conduct reports in Ohio in 2002; volleyball had the highest return of officials ballots (100%) to the OHSAA; there were concerns raised about misinterpretations about the game and match limitations
- Ocoaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed; **proposals to the OHSAA/National Federation were**: to continue with the 60 second time-out; the OHSVCA wrote & presented a position paper AGAINST rally scoring and the 3 out of 5 game format (rally scoring was only voted for by 1 district out of the 16)
- O Bonnie Page reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact Netter; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well; Annette Neighbarger had decided to take the year off

- o The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Baden; membership cards were needed to enter; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- 2002 Hall of Fame inductees were Nancy Hanger of Clyde HS, Bob Price of
 Westerville South HS, and Rich Woodman of Mentor HS! There is a plaque in the
 OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees
- o In November, it was decided to change the following concerning poll and All-Ohio voting: poll voters had to vote 5 out of the 6 times to be able to vote for one of his/her players, the final poll vote be moved to Sunday night, the poll voters tally sheet be printed in the newsletter, and any coach sending a cover letter would have their athletes deemed ineligible for All-Ohio and receive a letter stating the consequences; it was also decided to quit giving the planner at the clinic since the forms were on the website
- 2002 Media Awards were presented to John Cummings, the Miamisburg/West
 Carrollton News, Gary Ogel, Telegraph Forum, Aaron Korte, Daily Chief Union,
 Ben Robinson, webmaster of the Lady Buccs.com, Mike Smith, WKKJ Radio of
 Chillicothe, Dan Clutter, Telegraph Forum, Joe Davis, Marietta Times, and Mark
 Miller, The Vindicator
- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- In the December newsletter, President Carol Russo thanked Wooster HS and Anita Jorney-Gifford for an excellent All-Star Weekend; Cathie Kindler and Mike Siebert also received kudos for their work on the OHSVCA poll and website; changes were made for future polls to allow more time for voting and a change in the ballot forms to emphasize OHSVCA rules being followed; Carol also reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and Individual Scholastic Awards; also listed was Elite Camp news, minutes of the November meeting, All-Ohio teams, final polls, and All-Star Match teams

THE STATE VOLLEYBALL COACHES CLINICS: 1996 - 2002

- ❖ The Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee of the OHSAA organized and conducted the state volleyball clinics from 1973 to 1983
- The state rules interpretation meeting and a lunch were provided at the early clinics and have continued as a part of the clinics (if the clinic was in August/September)
- ❖ The clinic was a one day event from 1973 to 1979; in 1980, the format changed to a two day clinic to accommodate the need for more information and the different level of coaches in attendance
- ❖ In 1977, the state championship coaches were asked to begin speaking at the clinic
- The Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association have organized and conducted the state coaches clinics for volleyball since 1984
- ❖ The state volleyball coaches clinics has been one of the most well attended of the sport clinics in Ohio for the thirty plus years of its existence

1996 - AUGUST 2ND & AUGUST 3RD (Friday and Saturday)

With Bob Price as the coordinator for the clinic, it was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic once again offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Fran Ralston-Flores, head volleyball coach at the University of Ketucky; featured speakers were Audrey Depronio (Ohio State) and Ellen Dempsey (Ohio University), Bruce Boguski of The Winners Edge and Josh Katz of Prep Performance; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered;; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams

1997 - AUGUST 1ST & AUGUST 2ND (Friday and Saturday)

The clinic was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Linda Grensing, head volleyball coach at Duke University; featured speakers were Geri Polvino (Eastern Kentucky University) and Carolyn Condit (Miami University), Greg Smith (Ohio State) and Ellen Dempsey (Ohio University; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well

as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered;; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams

1998 - AUGUST 7TH AND AUGUST 8TH (Friday and Saturday)

The clinic was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Greg Giovanazzi, head volleyball coach at the University of Michigan; featured speakers were Kent Miller (University of Toledo) and Elizabeth Zicha (Muskingum College); cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered;; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams

1999 - AUGUST 6TH AND AUGUST 7TH (Friday and Saturday)

Bob Price, Clinic Coordinator for the OHSVCA, once again held the clinic at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Teri Clemens, head volleyball coach at Washington University in St. Louis; prior to the clinic Mrs. Clemens took ill and was replaced by Mike Sweitzer of the University of Akron; featured speakers were Rob Sweeney of Inside Out, Elizabeth Zicha of Muskingum College, Ethan Reeves, Strength Coach at Ohio University, Chris Carr from Ohio State University, and Grace Hutchinson of Norwalk HS; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered;; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; the Planner/Scheduler was included for the second year

2000 – AUGUST 4TH & 5TH (Friday and Saturday)

Bob Price, Clinic Coordinator for the OHSVCA, once again held the clinic at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Cecile Reynaud, head volleyball coach at Florida State University; featured speakers were Elizabeth Zicha of Muskingum College, Ethan Reeves, Strength Coach at Ohio University, Chris Carr from Ohio State University, and state championship coaches; cost of the clinic (including yearly

membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; the Planner was included for the third year and coaches received a shoulder bag with a strap

2001 – AUGUST 3rd & 4TH (Friday and Saturday)

The OHSVCA clinic was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Chuck Erbe, head volleyball coach at Michigan State University and Mike Lessinger of Ohio University; featured speakers were Grace Hutchinson of Norwalk HS, Jody Rhomberg, Jennifer Carter, and Heather Luke from the Ohio State University, and state championship coaches; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level; a scrimmage board was included for all teams; the Planner was included for the third year and coaches received a zippered, two-tone zippered clipboard; door prizes continued to be a big hit

2002 - AUGUST 2nd & 3rd (Friday and Saturday)

The OHSVCA clinic was moved to Westerville NORTH HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinician was Robert Patrick, head volleyball coach at Tennessee, and Keylor Chan, head volleyball coach of Northwestern University; featured speakers were Carolyn Condit, Miami University, Kelley Hartley, head coach at IPFW, Jolynn Tracy, Wright State University, Rob Beam, Asst. Coach, Wright State University, and state championship coaches; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$75.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level; a scrimmage board was included for all teams; the Planner was included again and coaches received a coaches bag; door prizes continued to be a big hit

THE OHSAA VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENTS: 1996 - 2002 A FEW BRIEF FACTS

- ✓ All schools were/are eligible for the OHSAA Volleyball tournaments as long as they were in good standing with the OHSAA
- ✓ In 1990, the tournament switched from a three class system to four divisions with Division I consisting of the large schools and Division IV consisting of the small schools
- ✓ A school's division was determined by the number of girls in the 9th, 10th, and 11th grades from the previous school year (the method to determine class had been based upon the upper three grades for a period of time)
- ✓ Advancement through the tournament trail was/is as follows: the sectional tournament, the district tournament, the regional tournament (also called the "Sweet Sixteen"); and the state tournament (Final Four)
- ✓ The tournaments are all single elimination tournaments
- ✓ Seeding for the top teams occurs only at the Sectional level
- ✓ The sectional and district tournaments are conducted by the six district boards in the state (Central, Eastern, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, and Southwest); the regional and state tournaments are under control of the OHSAA
- ✓ Teams were allowed to dress twelve academically eligible players for the tournaments; those twelve could change throughout the tournament as long as they were academically eligible (later changed to fifteen could dress if eligible)
- ✓ The first state tournament ticket cost \$2.00, the program .50 cents (1975); in 1990 the programs cost rose to \$2.00 and stayed at that price through 2002; cost to attend the 1990 1992 state tournaments was \$5.00 per session
- ✓ The 1990 State Volleyball Tournament Program carried a picture of Dolores Billhardt and information about the Memorial Scholarship set up in her name
- ✓ The 1984 state tournament was the last one to be held at Otterbein College, as the attendance had outgrown the Rike Center; Dr. Jo Ann Tyler had been in charge of the first nine tournaments; in 1985, the tournament moved to the The Ohio State University, St. John Arena for one year with Dr. Phyllis Bailey the tournament manager
- ✓ After 1985, the tournament moved to the University of Dayton with Dr. Elaine Dreidame acting as the tournament manager; the tournament was held at UD through 1990

- ✓ In 1990, all semi-finals were played on Thursday and Friday and all finals were played on Saturday due to the switch to divisions (eight matches for the semis and four for the finals)
- ✓ In 1991, the State Volleyball Tournament was moved to Wright State University, the Nutter Center, and has stayed there through 2002
- ✓ In 1991, slight adjustments were made on the starting times of the matches, and the divisions were then rotated each year so the same divisions were not always playing first on Thursday or last on Saturday

A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE MAJOR

RULES AND REGULATIONS IN VOLLEYBALL 1996 - 2002

(National Federation Rules and the Ohio High School Athletic Association)

- In 1974, the state of Ohio switched from the DGWS Rulebook for Volleyball to the National Federation of State High School Associations edition of volleyball rules
- The rules of the National Federation will be indicated with a **checkmark** and come from the front of each of the rulebooks to indicate major rule changes for that year
- Rules and regulations of the OHSAA will be indicated with an arrow
- In 1984, the Publicity Chairman for Ohio was Hank Zaborniak, Jr. He was in charge of spreading information pertaining to officials and the officiating program in Ohio to the entire nation
- Rules interpreters were Deborah Moore, Steve Trout, Diane Plas, and Keith Fisher

1996: Becky Oakes was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, lineup sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 65; the case book is 88 pages long

- ✓ The serving area was the entire endline from sideline to sideline
- ✓ Player(s) could touch a nonplayable area (team benches, officials table, bleacher, etc) provided the plane of the area was not broken or an advantage was gained
- ✓ When an entire team wore illegal uniforms, there was only one penalty assessed and the state association was notified
- ✓ A team was to rotate after every side out had been awarded to their team
- ✓ The team's first server was to be circled on the line-up sheet
- ✓ Written rosters and current line-ups had to remain at the official's table throughout each game
- ✓ Each team's line-up had to be submitted in writing prior to each game
- ✓ The first server of the game was the player in the right back position; when the other team was awarded their first side-out, the team was to rotate one position so the starting right front became it's team's first server
- ✓ Substitutes no longer had to report his/her number or the number of the player being replaced
- ✓ The red/yellow card system was no longer an option for a State Association
- ✓ SIGNALS: "Begin serve" was same as other volleyball rule codes

In 1996 – 97, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Ohio was to experiment with multiple contacts on the first contact provided no setting action occurred
- For varsity matches, two OHSAA registered officials be required; one class 1 official and the second one could be a class 1 or 2
- Lettering or emblems on Ohio uniforms had to pertain to the school name, team nickname, the individual's name or sport

1997: Dr. Deborah Moore was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules and the same items as 1996, and was 67 pages long

- ✓ The ball was considered out of bounds and became dead when it touched or entered (from the court) a nonplayable area
 - <u>Rationale</u>- it was legal for the ball to pass over a nonplayable area on its path BACK to the court after it had been legally played from a playable area
- ✓ The air pressure in the ball was to be 4.3-4.6 pounds per square inch Rationale- to promote defensive play
- ✓ A team had to start a match with six players in legal uniforms or be penalized with a point/sideout at the beginning of the match; state association was to be notified Rationale- clarified when a team penalty was assessed for illegal uniforms

- ✓ While across out-of-bounds extension of the center line, a player could play a ball which was not completely across the plane of the net extended

- Rationale- eliminated another situation for stoppage of play
- ✓ The substitute should report his/her number and the number of the player being replaced to the umpire
 - Rationale- officials may request substitutes provide the information
- ✓ It was considered unsportsmanlike conduct for a coach, player or other team personnel to make any excessive requests designed to disrupt the game
 - Rationale- clarified a violation when requests were designed to disrupt the game
- ✓ Official Signals- the umpire was not to touch the net on the "net foul" signal

 Rationale- eliminated the need for the umpire to walk onto the court to give the signal to the referee

In 1997 – 98, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Permitted multiple contacts on a team's first hit provided there was no setting action
- Permitted back row players to attempt to block
- Permitted insignificant contact with the net (player could not be playing the ball)
- ➤ High school volleyball teams were permitted 22 contests in 18 playing dates in the regular season and five scrimmages or four scrimmages and a preview for the entire season; junior high school teams were permitted 16 matches and one post season tournament not to exceed 3 matches as well as two scrimmages or one scrimmage and one preview
- ➤ Coaching and instruction began based upon when school started

1998: Dr. Deborah Moore was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, card system for handling unsportsmanlike conduct violations, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, revisions to the 1998-2000 Case Book, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 59; the case book is 95 pages long

- ✓ By state association adoption, rally scoring could be used in the 5th game of any 3 out of 5 game match
 - Rationale- reduces the time required to play a five game match
- ✓ Beginning with the 1999-2000 season, the ball included the NFHS authenticating mark

 Rationale- verifies the importance using conforming equipment that promotes fairness and consistency

- ✓ A single manufacturer's logo/trademark was permitted on each piece of the uniform not to exceed 2 ¼ square inches
 - Rationale- better accommodates various shapes of manufacturer's logos/trademarks
- ✓ Referee was to replace a scorer, timer, or line judge that was not performing his/her duties properly
 - Rationale- as the head official, referee must maintain an effective officiating crew
- ✓ Rosters were to be submitted 10 minutes prior to end of time prematch warm up Rationale- accuracy of timing the deadline
- ✓ Blocking a served ball was not permitted; Attacking a served ball was not permitted Rationale- keeps the serve as an offensive power in the high school game
- ✓ A team member could report the number(s) of the substitute(s) and the player(s) being replaced when substitution occurred during a time-out

In 1998 – 1999, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- ➤ The OHSAA had NOT adopted rally scoring, therefore all matches in grades 7-12 played 2 out of 3 games to 15 points
- ➤ The 2 inch centerline was required; markings did not need to be permanent
- > Friendship bracelets were considered jewelry
- ➤ There was a new process for selecting tournament officials (all coaches submitted a rating form at the seeding meeting)

1999: Dr. Deborah Moore was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, card system for handling unsportsmanlike conduct violations, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, revisions to the 1998-2000 Case Book, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 61; the case book is 95 pages long

- ✓ Numbers could have a single contrasting color border or shadow not exceed ½ in width Rationale- consistent with other NFHS rule codes for borders
- ✓ The scorer no longer had to transfer warnings, penalties, and disqualifications or equipment/ uniform violations from game to game
 - Rationale- unnecessary repetition
- ✓ Contact was any touch of the ball by a player excluding the hair

- <u>Rationale</u>- consistent with hair touching the net not counting as a violation (not considered a body part)
- ✓ When two opponents caused the ball to come to rest above the net (a joust) through simultaneous contact, play continued
 - Rationale- consistent with other rules about simultaneous contact
- ✓ Unnecessary delay is called when a delay is caused by the cleaning up of liquid or other substances used by a team during a time out

 Rationale- there is only a delay if clean up is required

In 1999 – 2000, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- ➤ All matches in Ohio would be 15 points, best 2 out of 3, grades 7-12
- The 2 inch centerline was required; markings did not need to be permanent
- The starting date for volleyball in Ohio was August 9
- ➤ There were no experimental rules for 1999

2000: Dr. Deborah Moore was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, card system for handling unsportsmanlike conduct violations, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 60; the case book is 95 pages long

- ✓ The ball was to be spherical with a laceless molded cover of 12 or more white pieces of genuine or simulated smooth leather. It had to measure between 25 − 27 inches in circumference, with a weight of 9-10 ounces when inflated with 4.3 to 4.6pounds per square inch of air pressure Rationale- none given
- ✓ The recommendation of a 2 inch number placed on the sleeve was DELETED.

 Rationale- eliminated an unnecessary expense for the schools of a recommendation
- ✓ Each line judge was to assist the referee and umpire by communicating when a ball touched the ceiling or an overhead obstruction (when out of view by the officials) and to let the referee know when the ball was inbounds when it landed near any area for which the line judge was responsible
 - <u>Rationale</u>- the referee was ultimately responsible for calls, attentive line judges could assist when asked to do so by the referee
- ✓ The use of flags by line judges was optional

- Rationale- the signal by a line judge could be clearly seen if flags were used
- ✓ A contact was any touch of the ball by a player, except the player's LOOSE hair

 Rationale- the point of emphasis was loose hair, not the top know of a pony tail or other hair near the scalp
- ✓ Multiple contacts were more than one contact by a player during one attempt to play the ball; multiple contacts were permitted only: when the first ball over the net rebounds from one part of the player's body to one or more other legal parts in attempt to block; on any first team hit, whether or not the ball was touched by the block, provided there was no finger action Rationale- this rule change had received support on recent surveys and was consistent with trends in other rule code books

In 2000 - 2001, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- ➤ It was required to have 2 OHSAA officials for varsity matches with the referee required to be a Class 1 official; for reserve/junior varsity matches 2 OHSAA were required, either Class 1 or 2; for freshmen matches and grades 7-8 matches, the referee was required and two officials were recommended
- ➤ Grades 9-12 volleyball teams were permitted a maximum of 5 scrimmages plus a preview for the entire season; if no preview was played, the maximum was still 5 scrimmages
- ➤ The starting date for volleyball in Ohio was August 7
- The regional tournament was to be held over two days
- ➤ A team was permitted 18 subs in any one game, individual players had unlimited entries within the team limitations

2001: Sheryl Solberg was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, card system for handling unsportsmanlike conduct violations, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 68

- ✓ Effective with the 2002-2003 season, all uniforms had to be free of all hard and unyielding items such as buttons, zippers, snaps and fasteners
 - Rationale- restriction from uniforms with hard and unyielding adornment

- ✓ Placed so the top of the number on the front of the uniform was no more than 5 inches down from the shoulder seam; or placed so the number was centered NO MORE THAN 2 INCHES BELOW THE NECKLINE OPENING on the upper body
 - Rationale- the upper body of the uniform top provided a clear view of the number
- ✓ Notify the coach when a team used its 15th, 16th, 17th, and 18th substitute Rationale- consistent with the substitution rules
- ✓ Notify the umpire when a 19th substitute was requested Rationale- consistent with the substitution rules
- ✓ Indicate when the ball touched the net, net antennas, and/or net supports not entirely between the net antennas
 - Rationale- clarified that the antennas were out of bounds
- ✓ Delete- combined with 5-7-3-c
- ✓ Two minutes prior to the end of the timed pre-match warm-ups, a coach from each team shall submit to the scorer an accurate, written lineup of the uniform numbers for the six starting players in the proper serving order (note: THE POSITIONS ON THE SUBMITTED WRITTEN LINEUP TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER THE CIRCLED PLAYER. Preventive officiating should be used when the first server's number is not circled.)
 - <u>Rationale</u>- addition of wording in the rule for clarification purposes
- ✓ Omit "With the intention of" from the definition of attack

 Rationale- results are officiated rather than defined by intent
- ✓ Attack: an attack was an action, other than a block or serve, that directs the ball into the opponent's team area
 - Rationale- provided clarity for standard terminology within the rule
- ✓ A request for substitution was not recognized if made by anyone other than a coach or substitute entering the substitution zone
 - <u>Rationale</u>- the change supported the rule change which allowed 18 team substitutions and unlimited individual entries within the 18 team limit
- ✓ Substitutes entering the substitution zone constituted a request without the coach giving a visual signal
 - <u>Rationale</u>- the change supported the rule change which allowed 18 team substitutions and unlimited individual entries within the 18 team limit
- ✓ A team was allowed a maximum of 18 substitutions per game. Each player was allowed unlimited entries within the team limit. Starting the game did not count as a substitution. An

illegal substitution did not count as an entry provided the illegal substitute was removed from the court

<u>Rationale</u>- this rule change allowed teams to play consistently, by allowing them to have choice of player on the court throughout the contest

- ✓ When teams had exhausted their 18 team substitutions or when no legal substitute was available, an exceptional substitution was permitted only for an injured or ill player in the following priority:
 - 1- by a player who had never played in the game or a player who had played in that position earlier in the game
 - 2- by any legal player on the bench, regardless of previous position played. An injured or ill player replaced by an exceptional substitution could not re-enter a game in which the exceptional substitution took place. A team could not play with fewer than 6 players if there was a legal substitute available

<u>Rationale</u>- the change supported the rule change which allowed 18 team substitutions and unlimited individual entries within the 18 team limit

✓ a substitution was illegal when the substitute: re-entered or attempted to re-enter as a 19th substitution

<u>Rationale</u>- the change supported the rule change which allowed 18 team substitutions and unlimited individual entries within the 18 team limit

In 2001 - 2002, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

> I CAN NOT PROVIDE THIS INFORMATION DUE TO THE LOSS OF MY FOLDER FOR OFFICIATING FOR THE 2001-2002 YEAR

2002: Sheryl Solberg was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, card system for handling unsportsmanlike conduct violations, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, officials code of conduct, mission statement for the NFHS, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 67; the case book was 93 pages long

- ✓ Prior to the match, officials would meet with the head coaches and captains to discuss sportsmanship expectations; coaches would verify that their players' equipment and uniform would be legal
 - Rationale- consistent with other NFHS rule books
- ✓ Players were not to wear body paint or glitter on their hair, face, uniform or body

 <u>Rationale</u>- to support the interpretation that was given to officials, but not supported in the rule or case books
- ✓ Notify the umpire when a team used its 15th, 16th, 17th, and 18th substitute

 <u>Rationale</u>- consistent with the substitution rules; open communication between scorekeeper and umpire
- ✓ Notify the official when a team reaches game point Rationale- opened communication to avoid error
- ✓ Two minutes prior to the end of the timed pre-match warm-ups, a coach from each team shall submit to the scorer an accurate, written lineup of the uniform numbers for the six players in the floor positions they would occupy at the start of the game

 Rationale- to clarify the position of the players on the floor as submitted on the written line up indicating the serving order; the act of circling the first server was a courtesy and had no bearing on the first server
- ✓ A back row player could not be called for a foul or a penalty until the ball had completely crossed the net or was blocked by the opponent

 Rationale- clarified to the official that the ball was considered to have crossed the net when it had passed beyond the vertical plane of the net or was legally blocked
- ✓ During any dead ball, the umpire could be asked to review the accuracy of the score, verify the number of time-outs used or the serving order of his/her team, or to verify the proper serving order of the opponent
 - Rationale- the rule specified to whom the request could be made

In 2002 - 2003, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- > States were beginning to experiment with rally scoring, but not Ohio or the NFHS
- Coaching and instruction could begin on August 5, first match August 24
