The goal of this paper/project is to provide a background regarding the growth of the sport of volleyball in Ohio, to record major information about volleyball and the OHSAA, and to record major information of the OHSVCA. It will be presented during the summers of 2004 through 2008, the OHSVCA's 25th anniversary. **There is one minor change for this final part: it will not be completed until the end of November, 2008, so that all the information for that year will be included.** And, by the way, I have decided to add a part 6 which will completed in 2009.

This paper will also give coaches/schools access to the history of their school in volleyball in terms of state honors, all-star matches, and state tournament results. If anyone knows of a former coach that coached in the early years of the sport, please let that person know this paper is available on line. Junior high/ middle school and boys' volleyball information will be kept to a bare minimum as my primary interest and concern is with girls' high school volleyball.

A great amount of the information listed below came from a paper I wrote in 1990-1992 while obtaining my masters degree. Many different sources were used to gather this information including the following:

- Interviews of different individuals around the state concerning volleyball; people interviewed included: Charlotte Basnett (first OHSVCA Executive Secretary), Chuck Braden (New Knoxville), Lucille Burkett (Shaker Heights, DGWS Chair), Hildred Byrkett (Troy), Chuck Dorsey (Jackson), Rod Ebright (Grandview Heights & Sports Imports), Dorothy Edwards (Elida), Diana Ford (Bexley), Lois Harkins (Federal Hocking), Randy Heath (Jackson Journal Herald), Margaret "Peg" Love (Department of Education), Bob MacFarland (Stow), Carol Mertler (Ashland College), Radonna Miller (Upper Arlington), Dr. Deborah Moore (OHSAA), "Bernie" Reinhardt (Lima Shawnee), Char Sharp (Archbold), Agnes Timmons (Barnesville), Dr. Jo Ann Tyler (Otterbein College), and Lori Wagner (Mansfield). If you know of someone I should interview, please let me know! I interviewed Sue Brady of Oberlin High School & Kathleen Harris of West Holmes High School the summer of 2005. Coach Brady started teaching in 1958 at Oberlin and began the girls' athletic programs at that school. Coach Harris began the girls' athletic program at West Holmes in the 60's. It was a complete joy to listen to their memories!!!
- Books written about volleyball and various volleyball magazines

- The OHSAA office and past issues of their magazine, <u>THE BULLETIN</u> (1922-1940) and <u>THE ATHLETE</u> (1941-2005); also booklets dealing with girls' sports such as "Guidelines for Girls' Sports Programs in Ohio" (1970); and the State Volleyball Tournament programs (1975 – present)
- My own files, which included information about the Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee, the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association including the OHSVCA newsletters (1983-2004), planners, and All-Star programs, District 5 Volleyball Coaches Association All-Star Match programs, the National Federation rule books, and bulletins from the OHSAA office
- The national office of the National Association for Girls' & Women in Sports and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance for rule books, and other pieces of pertinent information
- Donated material from various individuals such as Diana Ford, Margaret Love, Chuck Braden, and Anita Jorney-Gifford
- Additional help from the OHSAA office and Brandy Young in providing the results of the state tournaments during the '90s

I would like to mention that when the OHSAA stopped sending the magazine, <u>THE ATHLETE</u> to officials, and the OHSVCA decided to stop printing a newsletter, my sources for double checking and confirming information did get a little tougher.

A BRIEF REVIEW OF THE YEAR OF 2003

- Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2003 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state as well as decisions of the OHSAA:

- Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA were raised to \$25.00, lifetime fee at \$150.00;
 Lifetime membership will go to \$200.00 in 2004
- Groups or businesses could place an ad in our newsletter with the rates based upon spaced used; contact person was Laura Smith
- The division numbers for 2003 were: Division IV 1-132; Division III 133-221;
 Division II 222-387; Division I 388 and up; there were 781 teams playing volleyball in 2003
- In January of 2003, the National Federation adopted rally scoring for the 2003 season with all schools having to adopt in 2004; matches would be the best 3 out of 5 to 25 points and no cap, and the 5th game would be played to 15 points with no cap; it was also approved for all time outs to be 60 seconds unless both teams were ready to resume play, and the let serve would count; President Russo began gathering questions/concerns dealing with rally scoring for presentation to the OHSAA as Ohio would not adopt rally scoring until 2004
- At the Winter Work Session for the OHSVCA in March, plans were discussed for the clinic and the 20th anniversary of the OHSVCA in August, a complete session on rally scoring was allotted, a teleconference with our webmaster, Mike Seibert was scheduled, contracted positions and job descriptions were discussed, as well as changes to the constitution (changes to the constitution/bylaws are voted on by the membership at the clinic's general meeting); reminder that the planner would not be part of the coaches packet at the clinic
- The NCAA changed rules about contact time for Division I coaches which meant they
 would not be allowed to work at the Elite Camp; Division II and III coaches replaced the
 DI coaches, and if any coaches were interested in being a 'gofer' for the Elite Camp, they
 were to contact Grace Hutchinson
- The Baden Lexum 15-0 ball was once again the official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA; coaching and instruction could begin on August 4th, first match on August 23rd
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville South HS</u> on Friday, August 1st, and Saturday, August 2nd; main speakers would be Kim Berrington of Eastern Michigan University, and Judy Greene of the University of Alabama; Clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; OHSVCA apparel would be available for purchase and

ordering; cost of the clinic was \$100.00 which also included the 20th Anniversary Banquet; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; a drill book, and a portfolio would be given; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; Laura Smith once again sent a flyer to all the high schools and junior high schools in Ohio about the clinic

- All forms, association information, etc. would be available on our website; the All-Ohio form reminded coaches not to attach anything to the form and not to include pictures
- In the sixteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 58 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic; the scholar athlete award: 729 athletes received a certificate of honor
- The 2003 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Nancy Hoover of Old Fort High School! Nancy has coached varsity for 22 years and has over 300 wins; Her award would be given to her at the August clinic
- Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him by July 15th in order to have these awards ready for the clinic
- At the April 8, 2003 board meeting, the following items were discussed and acted upon: four new standing committees were formed (bylaw change): constitution/bylaws (report to the vice-president), ways and means (report to the recording secretary), events (report to the treasurer), and miscellaneous (report to the president); elections in August would include the offices of vice-president and recording secretary; changes for the constitution and bylaws were voted on and would be approved at the clinic by the membership; anyone wishing to be a poll voter needed to contact Cathie Kindler; any info for the website needed to be sent to Mike Seibert; Anita Jorney-Gifford reminded trustees to inform their coaches that they needed to be a member of the OHSVCA in order for their player to participate in the All-Star Match; information on the 20th Anniversary Banquet (Italian buffet, casual dress) was presented by Jayne Klingel & Cathy Ames, favors needed to be voted on; Rich Woodman was still working on the OHSVCA trademark (Rich is a very patient man!); Hall of Fame nominations were due at the next meeting
- Next Board meeting would be held at Westerville South HS on July 31st; All-Session Passes for the state volleyball tournament were going to be sold at the clinic
- Over 550 persons pre-registered for the August clinic!

- The 2003 All-Star Match Weekend would once again be held at Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 15) and the matches on Sunday (November 16); Anita Jorney –Gifford was once again in charge
- Schools were encouraged to call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Grace Hutchinson reported that the thirteenth annual Elite Camp was one of the best camps held for the 73 participants; it was held at Ohio Northern University in July; Chuck Braden was assisting; the camp was self-supporting; pins were given to the participants; a session on college recruiting was a great success
- Scholarship winners for 2002-2003 were: Division I Katie Flowers, Twinsburg HS; Division II – Victoria Kasten, Norwalk HS; Division III – Tealle Hunkus, Girard HS; Division IV – Lindsey Clark, Malvern HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Kristin Habeggar, Oregon Clay HS and Megan Schenk of Lima Central Catholic; each scholarship winner received \$500.00
- John Matune, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2003 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Cathy Ames of River View High School; her plaque was given to her at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed presented: the OHSVCA trademark was to be official by September!; the following was added to the All-Ohio nomination form- other sheets included with the nomination would make it invalid & tournament statistics were not to be included; to receive the individual scholarship certificate, the athlete must be a varsity award winner; raises were given to the position of Award Coordinator and the All-Star Match Coordinator; links were made available for all the districts in the state to the website; trustees were reminded to inform all coaches that an insurance waiver must be on file for all district all-star matches; discussion on Ohio using the libero in 2004; nominees for the Hall of Fame and Lifetime Achievement awards could be presented no more than 5 years in a row
- 2003 newsletters also listed summer camps and tournaments, information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records; also listed poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the

OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball

- Tournament info for 2003 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes
- September/October newsletters carried information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons for certain questions in "Who You Gonna Call"
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball and a survey that was done online on our website; this was the basis for many of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees during the clinic meetings; proposals were given to the OHSAA for their consideration: 1) in dual match competition, the full 20 minutes of warm up time be mandated at all levels; 2) athletes be allowed 5 games per common opponent for 2004; 3) during a dead ball, coaches be allowed to stand for instruction at the bench during the game; 4) if an ineligible player enters the match, that player will be removed from competition for the day and that game will be forfeited; if that is the deciding game of the match, the match is over; if a player is discovered to have played illegally after the conclusion of the match, the match is forfeited; also, we wanted the scorekeeper to mark in the scorebook the number of games played by each player so the officials are aware of the number of games played
- Bonnie Page reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact the OHSVCA Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well
- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Baden Sports; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter the Hospitality Room; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- Yoon Ha began working as our webmaster after Mike Seibert retired from coaching and resigning as our webmaster; a huge thank you to Mike for his effort and work on our webpage!

- 2003 Hall of Fame inductee was Karen Miller of Minford High School! Her name is now added to the plaque at the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees; Karen was honored at the All-Star Banquet in November at Wooster HS
- In November, Dr. Moore spoke about the tourney and other OHSAA issues with the OHSVCA Board; there were 5 unsportsmanlike reports to the OHSAA and 3 reports of good sportsmanship!; volleyball had the highest return of officials ballots (100%) to the OHSAA and the officials rating system was being reviewed again; there was lengthy discussion concerning rally scoring in Ohio for 2004
- 2003 Media Awards were presented to Jim Barstow, The Coshocton Tribune, Steve Large, The Valley Sports Journal, Heath Dawson, Jeff Harrison, Stephanie Peoples, and Darren McCullough of the The Daily Jeffersonian, Jeff Gates, Madison Press, and Judy Asp, Elyria Chronicle Telegram
- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- Total membership for the OHSVCA was a total of 1163 (by November) in 2003
- <u>The 2003 regional and state volleyball tournaments showed a profit of \$59, 055.01 after</u> earning \$35,291.84 in 2002
- In the December newsletter, President Carol Russo thanked Wooster HS and Anita Jorney-Gifford for an excellent All-Star Weekend; Cathie Kindler, Mike Siebert and Yoon Ha also received kudos for their work on the OHSVCA poll and website; changes were made for future polls to allow more time for voting and a change in the ballot forms to emphasize OHSVCA rules being followed; Carol also reminded coaches of out of season sports regulations, the forms available for SEI Award, Team Scholastic Awards, and Individual Scholastic Awards (a reminder that many of the forms were now due by February 28th); also listed was Elite Camp news, minutes of the November meeting , All-Ohio teams, final polls, and All-Star Match teams; treasurer's report showed an overall balance of \$88,000+; recognition went out to retiring trustees Sue Jackson (13), Bunny Brooks (15), Susie Harrison (10), and Dana Rivard (16); replacing them were Craig Axline (13), Betty Cameron (10 & Tina Jasinowksi (15); also retiring from coaching and her position as Junior High trustee, Bonnie Page
- At the December OHSAA Board of Control Meeting, the following OHSVCA Volleyball proposals for 2004 were passed: 1- all dual varsity matches shall be played under the NFHS rules; 2- all varsity and sub-varsity matches are played to 25 points (no cap) and

deciding games are played to 15 points (no cap); 3- all sub-varsity matches shall be best two of three games; 4- varsity teams playing in a 'multiple team' event (tri-matches, quads, tournaments, etc.) will play best two out of three games; 5- Ohio shall ask NFHS to experiment with the 'libero' beginning with the 2004 season; 7- (written by the OHSAA) sub-varsity players are limited to 4 games per common opponent; 8- the OHSAA tournament series, as varsity dual matches, shall be the best three out of five games. The following proposals were <u>denied</u>: 6- eliminate the '18 playing dates regulation and institute 22 matches on 22 playing dates; 8- schools shall play no more than one match per day in the OHSAA tournaments

- The OHSAA Board, by acting on the proposals in December and not waiting until April, allowed schools to begin getting contracts out for their 2004 schedules
- The final top twenty prep poll for November, 2003: (teams had to have at least 10 points to qualify to be in the poll)

- Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2004 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state as well as decisions of the OHSAA:
 - Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA was \$25.00, lifetime fee at \$200.00 for 2004
 - The division numbers for 2004 were: Division IV- 1-132; Division III-133-221;
 Division II-222-387; Division I- 388 and up; there were 798 teams playing volleyball in 2004
 - Ohio would begin playing volleyball under the rally scoring format in 2004; we were an experimental state for the use of the libero on the high school level (not used in the junior high game)

- At the Winter Work Session for the OHSVCA in March, plans were discussed for: the clinic in August, a complete session on rally scoring/libero, a meeting with our Baden representative, Bri Spiers, long range planning, rubric for salaries, the All-Star Matches, our website, as well as possible changes to the constitution (changes to the constitution/bylaws are voted on by the membership at the clinic's general meeting)
- With Clair Muscaro's retirement on July 31st, Dan Ross was named as the new OHSAA Commissioner, and he began his duties on August 1st; Mr. Muscaro served as the commissioner for fifteen years; the OHSVCA presented him with a gift certificate
- The Baden Lexum 15-0 ball was once again the official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA; coaching and instruction could begin on August 9th, first match on August 28th
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville South HS</u> on Friday, August 6th, and Saturday, August 7th; main speakers would be Jim Stone of The Ohio State University, and his assistant, Steve Colpus; the clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; OHSVCA apparel would be available for purchase and ordering; cost of the clinic was \$100.00; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; info about the clinic would be on the website
- In the seventeenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 65 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic and 709 individual athletes received a scholastic achievement certificate
- The 2004 Lifetime Achievement Award winners were Bonnie Paige of Adena Jr.
 High and Peg Funchion of Napoleon! Their awards were presented to them at the clinic in August
- By the end of March, our association showed a total of \$106,916.55 in our treasury; of course, many bills were yet to come with the clinic and all-star banquet/match
- At the April 6, 2004, OHSVCA board meeting, the following items were discussed and (possibly) acted upon: Bri Spiers, Baden representative, spoke to our group about our contract and customer service for Ohio; everyone was reminded that a high school team did not have to use a libero (it was an option), that the libero needed to wear a contrasting color uniform, and a tracker would need to be trained and available; the Events Committee should change their name to the Appropriations Committee (since they

worked with the budget concerns); elections in August would include the offices of president and treasurer; there were no changes for the constitution; anyone wishing to be a poll voter needed to contact Cathie Kindler; any info for the website needed to be sent to Yoon Ha; Anita Jorney-Gifford reminded trustees to inform their coaches that they needed to be a member of the OHSVCA in order for their player to participate in the All-Star Match; info about keeping score for rally scoring was available on the OHSAA website and the Indiana website had a tutorial for scoring; Laura Smith would send flyers out to all senior/junior high schools about the clinic (this would be the last time for Laura to do this); there was discussion about advertising on our website which would be researched by the Appropriations Committee; job descriptions were approved; the name Executive Secretary was changed to Clinic Registration/Membership Coordinator and the Recording Secretary had the word recording dropped from the name; the Drill Book and Webmaster were to be moved to outsource professionals; Hall of Fame nominations were due at the next meeting; Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him by July 15th in order to have these awards ready for the clinic

- At the April 8, 2004 OHSAA Board of Control meeting, it was noted that Sherril Appelfeller, Marion Elgin, was the NFHS Coaches Association State Award recipient for volleyball in 2003
- Next Board meeting would be held at Westerville South HS on August 5th; All-Session
 Passes for the state volleyball tournament were going to be sold at the clinic
- The last OHSVCA newsletter, Volume 21, Issue 4, came out in the Spring of 2004
- Over 700 persons pre-registered for the August clinic! Largest number ever!
- The OHSAA magazine, <u>THE ATHLETE</u> (August 2004), reminded students that effective for the 2004-2005 school year only those students who were entering grade 9 may enroll in and attend any member school that accepts them; students that were not enrolled in that particular school in 2003-2004 could have an eligibility issue; teams were also allowed to travel out of state one time only per sport per season to compete- provided there was no loss of school time
- The 2004 All-Star Match Weekend would once again be held at Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 20) and the matches on Sunday (November 21); Anita Jorney –Gifford was once again in charge; the Ways and Means Committee would research possible changes to the all-star matches because of

rally scoring; coaches and players would receive sweatshirts; Anita was resigning after this All-Star match; 2005 would be held at Hilliard-Davidson HS

- Schools were encouraged to e-mail or call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Grace Hutchinson reported that the fourteenth annual Elite Camp was one of the best camps, but was concerned about rising costs; it was held at Ohio Northern University in July; Chuck Braden was assisting; the camp was self-supporting; pins were given to the participants; many college coaches come to watch; as always, she could use more helpers
- Scholarship winners for 2003-2004 were: Division I Ashley Davis, Anderson HS; Division II – Megan Taylor, Lakeview HS; Division III – Kara Hemmelgarn, Versailles HS; Division IV – Elizabeth Homerosky, South Webster HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Ben Stewart, Batavia HS and Karli Townsend of Malvern; each winner received \$500.00
- John Matune, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2004 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Keith Rinehart of Springfield Shawnee High School; his plaque was given to him at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet; Kathy Mercer took over as the SEI Coordinator in November
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed 0 presented: this clinic had over 900 persons in attendance; the OHSVCA logo was to be included on as many OHSVCA items as possible to enhance our case for our trademark; Secretary Mindy Meyers reported membership at 1068 (included annual & lifetime); players names would be placed on the All-Ohio plaques, errors in spelling became the coaches responsibility; links were made available for all the districts in the state to the website; trustees were reminded to inform all coaches that an insurance waiver must be on file for all district all-star matches; discussion on Ohio using the libero in 2004; Cathy Ames presented Carol Russo and Deborah Moore the first part of the history of Ohio volleyball; the history was going to be done over five years and finish up with our 25th anniversary; the history is located on line; Sports Imports was our entitlement sponsor for our website; discussion was occurring about the OHSAA 'flash' photography proposal; a job target sheet was given to the trustees to assist them in their duties; voting for the polls was going to be on line in 2004; All-Ohio nominations could occur on line, but voting would be done by snail mail; match results could be posted on line

- Our website also provided information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records, a list of poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball
- Tournament info for 2004 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes; the OHSAA decided not to raise the compensation for the volleyball officials for the regional and state tournaments even with the change to rally scoring- it was a 'wait and see' decision; volleyball records and statistics were being kept by the OHSAA and were unofficial; they had to be submitted by an athletic administrator or a media member or a fan with documentation to verify the validity of the record
- Information about the polls, poll voters, reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament were found on the OHSVCA website; also listed the persons to contact for questions in various areas of concerns
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball and a survey that was done online on our website; this was the basis for many of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees during the clinic meetings; length of varsity matches were running anywhere from an hour to two hours depending on how many games were played by the competing schools; proposals were given to the OHSAA for their consideration
- Cheryl Palidar reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact the OHSVCA Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well
- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Baden Sports; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter the Hospitality Room; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- 2004 Hall of Fame inductees were Patty Pease of Fairbanks High School and Dan Smith of Ridgewood High School! Their names were added to the plaque at the

OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees; Patty and Dan were honored at the All-Star Banquet in November at Wooster HS

- In November, Dr. Moore spoke about the tourney and other OHSAA issues with the OHSVCA Board; a survey dealing with rally scoring was presented for possible changes to recommend to the OHSAA
- o 2004 Media Award was presented to Matt Hammond, Bellefontaine Examiner
- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- The OHSVCA proposed the following to the OHSAA: that schools be allowed to play 22 matches on 20 playing dates (assisted schools that are locked into 16-17 playing dates because of their conference and would allow for more 3 out of 5 matches); that players be allowed five games per day per common opponent as opposed to four
- The OHSAA recommended that the Baden 15-0 continue as the official ball in 2005 and Wright State University continue to host the state tournament

Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2005 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:

- Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA was \$25.00, lifetime fee at \$200.00
- The division numbers for 2005 were: Division IV- 1-126; Division III-127-223;
 Division II-224-399; Division I- 400 and up; there were 801 teams playing volleyball in 2005

- Ohio continued playing volleyball under the rally scoring format in 2005; varsity level played the best 3 out of 5 in dual matches; sub varsity matches played the best 2 out of 3 in all matches
- The OHSAA allowed our proposal of 22 matches on 20 playing dates in 2005, but denied the switch to 5 games per day per common opponent for any player participating in sub varsity competition
- At the Winter Work Session for the OHSVCA in March: plans were discussed for the clinic in August including CAP being involved with the clinic; we listened to Scott Ebright talk about Boys' Volleyball; Pres. Russo informed us Doug Beal would be at the 25th Anniversary Banquet; there was long range planning for our association; the All-Star Matches would be held at Hilliard-Davidson and Dave Holtsberry would be the coordinator; we discussed our website and some issues with it; we discussed poll voters and voting on line; discussion on length of matches survey, as well as possible changes to the constitution (changes to the constitution/bylaws are voted on by the membership at the clinic's general meeting); it was discussed that the OHSVCA president and treasurer should be bonded
- The Baden Lexum 15-0 ball was once again the official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA, but had to be branded with the OHSAA/OHSVCA logos; coaching and instruction could begin on August 8th, first match on August 27th
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville South HS</u> on Friday, August 5th, and Saturday, August 6th; main speakers would be Ray Gooden of Northern Illinois University, and Geoff Carlston of Ohio University; the clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; info about the clinic would be on the website
- In the eighteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 70 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic and 642 individual athletes received a scholastic achievement certificate
- The 2005 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Robert Shansky of East Liverpool High School! His award was presented to him at the clinic in August

- April 10, 2005, our association showed a total of \$144,000+ in our treasury; of course, many bills were yet to come with the clinic and all-star banquet/match, and this included a CD to help pay for the 25th Anniversary Banquet coming in 2008
- At the April 13, 2005, OHSVCA board meeting, the following items were discussed and (possibly) acted upon: Dr. Moore of the OHSAA informed us their would be a manual for coaches and officials coming with the rulebooks; the NFHS asked Ohio to be an experimental state in 2005 to allow the coach to stand at their bench during a dead ball; libero would be official in 2006; there would be a change in the evaluation procedure for the selection of tournament officials (coach, athletic directors, local associations, league assigners, district athletic boards, and the OHSAA; elections in August would include the offices of vice-president and secretary; Carol reminded coaches to send situations or concerns about officiating or rules to her; anyone wishing to be a poll voter needed to contact Cathie Kindler; any info for the website needed to be sent to Yoon Ha; Anita Jorney-Gifford reminded trustees to inform their coaches that they needed to be a member of the OHSVCA in order for their player to participate in the All-Star Match; Carol encouraged the trustees to go back to their districts and see if more individuals should be considered for the Hall of Fame, SEI Award, and the Lifetime Achievement Award; schools needed to be more aware of eligibility concerns with a school closing or a student moving; there would be a social time at the Embassy Suites on Friday for persons coming to the clinic and staying at the Embassy Suites; Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him by July 15th in order to have these awards ready for the clinic & he let us know that crystal volleyballs were no longer available for the 500 plateau winners- awards needed to be revised; the OHSVCA trademark was still an issue in the Spring of 2005; districts needed to use the website to help get information to their coaches; Division I coaches were going to be allowed to coach at the Elite Camp once again; Ways and Means committee presented some concerns with the poll, voting, and the website; constitution amendments would be voted on in August: to allow a school/coach a one year grace period when their school closed or dropped a program because of funding, the secretary and treasurer could be an associate member, but the president and vice-president had to be an active member; all levels were to keep track of their length of all their matches and submit to the OHSVCA; schools could apply for an equipment grant through the OHSVCA

- Next Board meeting would be held at Westerville South HS on August 4th; All-Session
 Passes for the state volleyball tournament were going to be sold at the clinic
- Over 600 persons pre-registered for the August clinic!
- The 2005 All-Star Match Weekend would be held at Hilliard Davidson HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 19) and the matches on Sunday (November 20); Dave Holtberry was the coordinator of the event; sweatshirts would once again be given to the participants
- Schools were encouraged to e-mail or call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Grace Hutchinson reported that the fifteenth annual Elite Camp was a successful camp & Jim Stone (OSU) enjoyed it very much; it was held at Ohio Northern University in July; Chuck Braden was assisting; the camp was self-supporting; pins were given to the participants; many college coaches came to watch; Grace reminded us that jr. high/middle school coaches could go to assist as gofers
- Scholarship winners for 2004-2005 were: Division I Sarah Garner, Westlake HS; Division II – Amanda Tedrick, Goshen HS; Division III – Katie Weininger, Mohawk HS; Division IV – Kelsey Schaffer, Marion HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Rachel Rafailedes, Canal Fulton Northwest HS and Joseph Russo of Elyria HS; each winner received \$500.00
- Kathy Mercer, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2005 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Monica Vanderhorst of St. Marys Memorial High School; her plaque was given to her at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed presented: the OHSVCA trademark was to be included on as many OHSVCA items as possible and the trademark was still not approved; Secretary Mindy Meyers reported membership at 979 (included annual & lifetime); Cathy Ames presented Carol Russo and Deborah Moore the second part of the history of Ohio volleyball; the history was going to be done over five years and finish up with our 25th anniversary; the history is located on line; Sports Imports provided lanyards for the clinic & Merrin Athletics provided the shirts for the clinic and the OHSVCA Board; discussion occurred about the length of matches and officials felt they should be paid more, the new bench rule; a job target sheet

was given to the trustees to assist them in their duties; voting for the polls was going to be on line; All-Ohio nominations would occur on line, but voting would be done by snail mail; match results could be posted on line; pay rubrics were finished

- Our website also provided information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records, a list of poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball; also, information about reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons to contact for questions in various areas of concerns
- Tournament info for 2005 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes; volleyball records and statistics were being kept by the OHSAA and were unofficial; they had to be submitted by an athletic administrator or a media member or a fan with documentation to verify the validity of the record
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for many of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees during the clinic meetings; length of varsity matches were running anywhere from an hour to two hours depending on how many games were played by the competing schools
- Cheryl Palidar reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact the OHSVCA Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well
- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Baden Sports; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter the Hospitality Room; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- 2005 Hall of Fame inductees were Sue Deas of West Branch High School and Mike Chaffee of Windham High School! Their names were added to the plaque at the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees; Sue and Mike were honored at the All-Star Banquet in November at Hilliard Davidson HS

- In November, Dr. Moore spoke about the tourney and other OHSAA issues with the OHSVCA Board; a survey dealing with rally scoring was presented for possible changes to recommend to the OHSAA; Mindy Myers resigned as the secretary and Erin Mayne from Upper Arlington served the remaining term of office; by October 31, there was a balance of \$88,000 in our checking and savings account; plans were finalized for the All-Star Matches at Hilliard Davidson
- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- The final top twenty prep poll for November, 2005: (teams had to have at least 10 points to qualify to be in the poll)

Srief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2006 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state as well as decisions of the OHSAA:

- Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA was \$25.00, lifetime fee at \$200.00
- The division numbers for 2006 were: Division IV- 1-126; Division III-127-223;
 Division II-224-399; Division I- 400 and up

- Ohio continued playing volleyball under the rally scoring format in 2006; it was apparent that rally scoring was not going away
- At the Winter Work Session for the OHSVCA in March: plans were discussed for the clinic in August; Pres. Russo reminded us Doug Beal would be at the 25th Anniversary Banquet and would be our keynote speaker; Doug Beal had expressed to Carol that he would like to see the boys join with the girls coaches association in volleyball; Bob Price suggested that the boys coaches association have their clinic with the OHSVCA; Carol was going to go to the Boys' Coaches Association meeting; the OHSVCA supports the Boys Association, but does not want to become financially tied to them; we asked the OHSAA Board of Control to allow the 3rd game (when playing 2 out of 3, all levels) be played to 25 points; the All-Star Matches would once again be hosted by Wooster as they were the only school to put a bid in to host; discussion on items for the 25th anniversary-needed to have our logo on them; discussion about going to the use of C-Vent to take care of our clinic registration, all-star match registration, and to develop a membership database- there would be a general fee and a fee per member; the OHSVCA had an application for an equipment grant to schools for \$1500.00
- The Baden Lexum 15-0 ball was once again the official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA, and had to have the OHSAA/OHSVCA logos on the ball; coaching and instruction could begin on August 7th, first match on August 26th
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville Central HS</u> on Friday, August 4th, and Saturday, August 5th; main speakers would be Rob Patrick of the University of Tennessee, and Geoff Carlston of Ohio University; the clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; info about the clinic would be on the website
- The OHSAA approved our proposal of playing to 25 points in the 3rd game of a 2 out of 3 game format for 2006; Ohio would be experimenting with having the libero serve in one rotation (not on the the junior high/middle school level)
- In the nineteenth year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 83 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic and 700+ individual athletes received a scholastic achievement certificate

- The 2006 Lifetime Achievement Award winner was Mark Williams of Pandora-Gilboa High School! His award was presented to him at the clinic in August
- At the April, 2006, OHSVCA board meeting, the following items were discussed and 0 (possibly) acted upon: Dr. Moore of the OHSAA informed us their would be a manual for coaches and officials coming with the rulebooks; the NFHS asked Ohio to be an experimental state in 2006 to allow the libero to serve for one player; elections in August would include the offices of president and treasurer; Carol reminded coaches to send situations or concerns about officiating or rules to her; anyone wishing to be a poll voter needed to contact Cathie Kindler; any info for the website needed to be sent to Yoon Ha; trustees were to remind their coaches that they needed to be a member of the OHSVCA in order for their player to participate in the All-Star Match; Carol encouraged the trustees to go back to their districts and see if more individuals should be considered for the Hall of Fame, SEI Award, and the Lifetime Achievement Award; there would be a social time at the Embassy Suites on Friday for persons coming to the clinic and staying at the Embassy Suites; Tom Kohl requested that Coaching Record Milestones be submitted to him earlier that July in order to have these awards ready for the clinic & rings or a lamp were available for coaches with 600 wins; the OHSVCA trademark was still an issue in the Spring of 2006; districts needed to use the website to help get information to their coaches; schools could apply for an equipment grant through the OHSVCA; next Board meeting would be held at Westerville Central HS on August 3rd; All-Session Passes for the state volleyball tournament were going to be sold at the clinic

• 617 persons pre-registered for the August clinic!

- The 2006 All-Star Match Weekend would return to Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 18) and the matches on Sunday (November 19); Anita Jorney-Gifford would return as the coordinator of the event; sweatshirts would once again be given to the participants
- Schools were encouraged to e-mail or call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Scholarship winners for 2005-2006 were: Division I Sally Ogle, Lakota West HS;
 Division II Laura Schumaker, Shawnee HS; Division III Tracy Needham,
 Marion River Valley HS; Division IV Leslie Hoelscher, Fort Loramie HS; and the

OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Samantha Klink, East Liverpool HS and Victoria Henkle of Parkway HS; each scholarship winner received \$500.00

- Kathy Mercer, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2006 SEI Award winner for volleyball was Tracey Kornau of Lakota West High School; her plaque was given to her at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed 0 presented: Secretary Erin Mayne reported membership at 1300, but their were duplicates in her list which needed to be updated and cleaned up (included annual & lifetime); Erin also did the name tags for the clinic which included a receipt for the coaches: Kave Keller presented the treasurer's report showing a total in our checking and savings accounts of \$125,000.00 (bills would begin to roll in from the Elite Camp, the clinic and the upcoming All-Star weekend); Cathy Ames presented Carol Russo and Deborah Moore with the third part of the history of Ohio volleyball; the history was going to be done over five years and finish up with our 25th anniversary; the history is located on line; Merrin Athletics provided the shirts for the clinic and the OHSVCA Board; a job target sheet was given to the trustees to assist them in their duties; there was a record number of vendors registered for the clinic- 26; thank you notes were received from two of the scholarship recipients and read to the trustees; Scott Taylor reported that the sixteenth annual Elite Camp was successful once again and the talent was continuing to be better and many college coaches came to watch; Yoon Ha was overloaded with work and was considering resigning as webmaster- Tom Kohl agreed to assist; the basketball coaches revamped one of our proposals on playing time to get more time for their sport; Kathy DeBoer was at our meeting representing the AVCA as we considered a partnership with them; proposal from the OHSAA on strobe flash photography was discussed- only for use by professional photographers; coaches were asked to keep track of their length of time for all games/matches this year because of the change in the 2 out of 3 games scoring; Dr. Moore discussed the fact that this was the 100th year for the OHSAA and state championship coaches would be recognized in a brief ceremony before each state championship match on Saturday; Cathy Ames was to get info to Dr. Moore to assist her on some of the history for the 100th Anniversary; Dr. Moore also informed us there was discussion on dropping the Thursday night semis (we obviously expressed our displeasure at this consideration); we were considering a mentoring program for coaches and we decided to add a clinic assistant as Bob Price was preparing in a year or two to

retire from the clinic coordinator position- Bob would work with them to train him/her for the clinic position; every effort would be made to keep the clinic at Westerville; we were looking to change hotels as there had been problems with the Embassy Suites; the use of C-Vent for on line registrations was still being discussed with several issues to be discussed & resolved; there were issues in using the students as demonstrators at the clinic due to OHSAA/NCAA rules; the Baden ball contract was up for review; an evaluation of the clinic would be made available on line; 761 coaches attended!

- Our website also provided information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records, a list of poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball; also, information about reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons to contact for questions in various areas of concerns
- Tournament info and seeding for 2006 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes; all districts were to have their draw meeting on a same universal date; volleyball records and statistics were being kept by the OHSAA and were unofficial; they had to be submitted by an athletic administrator or a media member or a fan with documentation to verify the validity of the record
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for many of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees during the clinic meetings
- Cheryl Palidar reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact the OHSVCA Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well
- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Baden Sports; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter the Hospitality Room; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials during the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament

- 2006 Hall of Fame inductee was Mike Seibert of Norwood & Cincinnati Ursuline Academy High Schools! His name was added to the plaque at the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees; Mike was honored at the All-Star Banquet in November at Wooster HS
- At the November OHSVCA Board Meeting, Dr. Moore spoke about the tourney and other OHSAA issues with the OHSVCA Board; we were going to be looking into a possible new ball contract; the OHSAA was going to continue to look at the Thursday night matches being absorbed into Friday; Carol Russo asked about having two sets of semis on Thursday and two on Friday- Dr. Moore said this could be given consideration; the surveys showed a positive regard towards high schools using the libero; we were reminded that Bylaw 10 (OHSAA) placed no restrictions on seniors; there were only 2 ejections of volleyball coaches this fall; the OHSAA was still working with the officials rating on line (officials needed to put their schedules into the computer); Dr. Moore recognized Carol Russo as the nominee for National Federation Coach of the Year; coaches that had made significant and impacting contributions to the game of volleyball would be honored; to help celebrate the OHSAA's 100th year of service to athletics in Ohio, multiple state championship coaches and selected players from those teams would be acknowledged at the state tourney; a Centennial article would be placed in the Plain Dealer; the Komen Foundation was working with volleyball coaches to run a fundraiser in 2007 to support Breast Cancer Awareness (Sycamore HS ran a fundraiser using a 'pink' theme; Kaye Keller let us know money was being set aside for the use of C-Vent (\$5000.00); a master contact list needed to be updated; a Christmas card list was being put together for principals of the schools of our board members; all forms on the website were being updated; survey results were available regarding the libero, officials' ratings, and tournament warm-up; Carol informed us the new commissioner was a volleyball person and our relationship with the board has been very positive; the Winter Work Session/Spring Meeting for 2007 already had several items on the agenda (clinic, Volley for the Cure, etc); Anita Jorney-Gifford reported on the status of the All-Star Match weekend and the responsibilities for the trustees; Carol talked for Bob Price about the need for a clinic assistant and Carol also presented poll/All-Ohio issues for Cathie Kindler; Tom Kohl had all the awards ready; concerns were voiced about 'home court' advantage during tournaments, especially teams getting to play the Districts, Regionals at the state tournament site; discussion continued about advertising on our website

(researched by Mark Williams and Kaye Keller); the OHSVCA survey showed that the coaches supported the libero serving and coaches wanted a change in the warm-up procedure to a possible 4-7-7-2; Yoon Ha was finished as our webmaster and the search was on for a new person to take over; Ohio was looking into teaming with the AVCA

- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA

Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 2007 in the OHSVCA and volleyball in the state through decisions of the OHSAA:

- Yearly membership fees for the OHSVCA was \$25.00, lifetime fee at \$200.00
- The division numbers for 2007 were: Division IV- 1-129; Division III-130-219;
 Division II-220-388; Division I- 388 and up; the division numbers would stay the same in 2008

At the Winter Work Session for the OHSVCA in March: the treasurer's report showed 0 over \$85,000+ in our checking and savings account; the OHSVCA had negotiated a new contract with Molten USA and Melissa Dawson was at our meeting to talk with our organization about their plans for our association- some of the items they would provide included one pink and white ball per head coach in Ohio for the Volley for the Cure program (available at the clinic), backpack at the coaches clinic, and mini-volleyballs for the participants in the All-Star Match; AVCA Executive Director Kathy DeBoer was introduced as our next guest and explained the pilot plan for Ohio to partner with the AVCA (data showed that volleyball was the number one sport in 22 states); the board had approved a new salaried position for a Technology Support Coordinator; Projections, Inc. was hired as a webmaster and Jeremy Stober was selected to work with them on our website; Jeremy would work with C-Vent; the contract with C-Vent is a 2 year contract as well as the contract with Projections, Inc; plans were discussed for the clinic in August- offices of vice-president and treasurer were to be on the ballot, Double Tree on Hutchinson Road would be the new host hotel for the clinic, we would be back at Westerville Central which did cost more, but provided more room & parking; Volley for the Cure would be in full swing for 2007 & they would have a session at the clinic (list of items given to the coaches can be found in the clinic section), board members would be receiving hot pink & orange t-shirts and a white golf shirt; Scholarship and Award winners needed to have coaches that were members; board members were to send an individual picture (wear a black shirt) to Jeremy for the website; Anita Jorney-Gifford explained the 2006 All-Star weekend went well and was very well attended- Wooster will host again, all information will be on line, trustees needed to be timely in getting info to their district coaches and players about the weekend; Historian Cathy Ames reported that part IV of the history would be ready for the clinic (years 1996-2002) and part V would be completed by Nov., 2008; discussion about the upcoming 25th Anniversary included where to host, favors, list of invitees, banquet menu, highlight DVD, C-Vent's role, & advertising for the event; \$12,000 was spent on the 20th Anniversary Banquet; Scott Taylor reported on the Elite Camp- already 100 registered campers for 2007 & coaches were still needed; Carol let us know the OHSAA was reorganizing schools by division this year and poll voters were still needed; Tom Kohl reported several 500 and 400 milestone award winners for this year; SEI coordinator Kathy Mercer reported a National Sportsmanship Day would occur (date to be determined); Jeremy Stober wanted to

possibly include a drill book on line for members only & was working on the spam issue; V-P Tracey Kornau reported on the Volley for the Cure- would be included as a session at the clinic, schools would wear pink t-shirts for uniforms (approved through OHSAA) and money raised would be for the Susan Koman Foundation; it was decided to roll the Winter Work Session and the Spring meeting into one weekend; Kathy Mercer requested more time to work on the clinic set-up and Carol wanted time to meet with the Executive Committee

- Because of the new ball contract with Molten USA, the official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA for 2007-2008 became the Molten IV58L-U; balls had to have the OHSAA & OHSVCA logos on the ball; coaching and instruction could begin on August 6th, first match on August 25th
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville Central HS</u> on Friday, August 3rd, and Saturday, August 4th; main speakers would be Cecile Reynauld of Florida State University, and Jim Stone of The Ohio State University; the clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; info about the clinic would be on the website
- In the 20th year of the Scholastic Team Award (all schools that carried a 3.500 gpa were honored) 83 schools qualified and received their certificates at the August clinic and 728 individual athletes representing 120 schools received a scholastic achievement certificate
- The 2007 Lifetime Achievement Award winners were Ron Kelley (Garaway, Barnesville & Union Local), Barry Stebbins (Columbus West), Connie Rusynyk (Elyria), and Lynn Jalowiec (Elyria West/Amherst Steele)! Their awards were presented either at the clinic in August or the All-Star Weekend Banquet
- The 2007 All-Star Match Weekend would return to Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 17) and the matches on Sunday (November 18); Anita Jorney-Gifford was once again the coordinator of the event; sweatshirts would once again be given to the participants as well as a mini-volleyball from Molten USA

- Schools were encouraged to e-mail or call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Scholarship winners for 2006-2007 were: Division I Ann Kohlmeyer, Lakota East HS; Division II Emily Borchers, Kettering Alter HS; Division III Mallory Earich, Westfall HS; Division IV Kim Workman, Southeastern HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Sara Smith, Frankfort Adena HS and Katie Robinson of Logan Elm HS; each winner received \$500.00
- Kathy Mercer, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2007 SEI
 Award winner for volleyball was Jim Glessner of Norwayne High School; his plaque
 was given to him at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed 0 presented: Scott Taylor was performing the duties of the secretary as Erin Mayne had resigned; all-Session Passes for the state volleyball tournament were being sold at the clinic; Kaye Keller provided the financial report of the OHSVCA including the fact we now had over \$25,000 in our 25th Anniversary Banquet CD; some individuals wanted to have their registration refunded, but our policy has been 'no refunds; Tracy Kornau was running unopposed as vice-president, while Scott Taylor and Doug Walters were running for secretary (Scott won); other websites were requesting to link to our website- we decided to allow this if approved through the Executive Committee; Volley for the Cure was in full go mode and schools were to order their pink shirts ASAP; Scott Ebright addressed the board on behalf of boys' volleyball; Kathy DeBoer spoke at the General Meeting in regards to the AVCA; Scott Taylor reported on the Elite Camp- some coaches had to be replaced at the last minute, which was probably due to the length of the camp and the coaching pay; Grace will work with ONU on costs issues; Cheryl Palidar reported on the jr. high/middle school section of the clinic; Kathy Mercer reported there was a new person at the OHSAA taking over the SEI Chair (Roxanne Price)- changes may be coming; Jeremy Stober reported that the clinic registration with C-Vent went well and a few glitches will be worked out for next year; Jeremy was still trying to resolve some issues with the district web pages and it was decided that lifetime members would have to have their information entered by hand to C-Vent; Cathy Ames presented Carol Russo and Deborah Moore with the fourth part of the history of Ohio volleyball; the history was going to be done over five years and would finish up after the completion of the 2008

season to include all information in the final year; the history is located on line; Merrin Athletics provided the shirts for the clinic and the OHSVCA Board; Mark Williams was voted on to the Executive Committee; Bob Price reported things were ready for the clinic and that The American Dairy Association would provide lunch on Friday with the traditional bagel lunch available for Saturday; Westerville Central's Booster Club took care of the concession stand; Kathy Mercer reported 24 vendors were here this year (a few were missing due to illness); next scheduled meeting would be Thursday, Nov. 8, in the Berry Room at the Nutter Center; post cinic meeting: decision to start the morning session later on Saturday (low attendance) for 2008; Jeremy Stober reported that schools' volleyball schedules could be posted on August 13; the clinic was another success!

o 638 persons pre-registered for the August clinic!

- Our website also provided information on the Elite Camp, application to be a poll voter, Jr. high records, a list of poll voters, membership form, and scholarship information (individual & team), coaches (jr. high and high school) that received awards for 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, and 600 wins, minutes from the OHSVCA Board meetings, officers, trustees, and coordinators as well as news about junior high volleyball; also, information about reporting scores, district information, statistical information for the nomination of players for All-Ohio, All-Ohio nomination forms, hotel information for the state tournament; also listed the persons to contact for questions in various areas of concerns
- Tournament info and seeding for 2007 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes; all districts were to have their draw meeting on a same universal date; volleyball records and statistics were being kept by the OHSAA and were unofficial; they had to be submitted by an athletic administrator or a media member or a fan with documentation to verify the validity of the record
- Coaches were to contact officers or their district trustees about any concerns in the state about volleyball; this was the basis for many of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Trustees during the board meetings as well as any surveys needing to be completed
- Cheryl Palidar reminded Junior High/Middle School coaches to send in their team records and to inform the OHSVCA when they reached a wins milestone for their award; anyone interested in being on the junior high board should contact the OHSVCA Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl; the Junior High portion of the Clinic went extremely well

- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Molten USA; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials at the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament
- 2007 Hall of Fame inductee was Lori Schwieterman of St. Henry High School! Her name was added to the plaque at the OHSAA with the names of all of the Hall of Fame inductees; Lori was honored at the All-Star Banquet in November at Wooster HS
- At the November OHSVCA Board Meeting, Dr. Moore spoke with the OHSVCA Board 0 about the tourney and other OHSAA issues - she talked about the excellent job Molten had done with the ball; the fact that the OHSAA experienced problems with their website concerning officials contracts and rating officials; that there were only 2 ejections of volleyball coaches this fall, but also one player; possible rule recommendation dealing with making a sub before the match (correctible error); that Roxanne Price was taking over for Duane Warns; that 'Volley for the Cure' was a huge success using a 'pink' theme; and that a DVD was being produced to be used in pre-season meetings with parents; Scott Taylor was updating the Christmas card list for principals of the schools of our board members; all forms on the website were being updated; Tracey Kornau shared the survey results with us dealing with Volley for the Cure, teams playing on their home courts during tournaments, color of the volleyball, strobe lighting, posting scores on the web, whether the coach(es) were a member of the OHSVCA, and length of matches statistics for all levels; Tracey reported the need for a 'Volley for the Cure' coordinator (Stacie Whetstone was elected), and Mark Williams became the new Assistant Clinic Coordinator; AVCA would have a 'Coach of the Year' for each state (had to be an AVCA member); questions about the Executive Committee- consists of the four officers and three trustees and they meet with the officers to discuss/decide issues for our organization and to meet in acts of emergency for our association; Carol Russo reminded board members to sign up to work the Hospitality Room and to present the final four pins; she reminded us that the Winter Work Session was our Spring meeting and that the Embassy Suites would host the 25th Anniversary Banquet (room for 250) on Friday night; Poll Coordinator, Cathie Kindler, informed us the AP would no longer carry our polls, that the poll voters did a great job voting this year, there were some problems with the All-Ohio voting numbers, and that Jeremy would continue to work on any web issues;

All-Star Match Coordinator, Anita Jorney-Gifford, let us know some coaches were not getting the information to their players and she still needed info from some of the players; trustees needed to sign up to work the All-Star weekend; and registration was on line for the Banquet; trustees had to remind their districts to get their information to their players about the Elite Camp as soon as possible; Awards Coordinator, Tom Kohl, announced that all the awards were ready for the tournament weekend and the All-Star weekend; discussion on some of the issues dealing with the 'Volley for the Cure'- primary issue was getting the t-shirts from the proper vendors in a timely fashion (part of the problem dealt with coaches changing the dates of their matches)- could other vendors provide shirts?; 68,000+ t-shirts were sold to teams, fans, and officials; final count on the money was not official yet, but appeared to be \$500,000+; Jr. High/Middle school director, Cheryl Palidar, wanted names for the clinic for their portion; report of the trustees discussed some of the following items- not knowing about the change in the warm-up times (why was it not announced at the rules meeting), schools wanting more than 4 games in a day per common opponent, is a district tournament meeting necessary, concerns about the Nutter Center hosting districts, regionals, and state which gives an advantage to the team(s) that play there, early start date, coaching seniors out of season, and college officials doing high school matches; discussion on the 25th Anniversary- need a logo designed, need to pick favors, update addresses on individuals, and decisions on who to invite; Don Conser of Salem HS was recommended for the Coach of the Year for the AVCA and the NFHS

- Carol Russo would be attending the AVCA national convention on behalf of Ohio and the OHSVCA
- On December 13, 2007, Don Conser was honored by the AVCA as a National High School Coach of the Year at a luncheon at the Annual Convention

- The division numbers for 2008 were: Division IV- 1-129; Division III-130-219;
- o Division II-220-388; Division I- 388 and up

- In February, the AVCA announced its' second High School Senior All-America Team for girls' volleyball; from Ohio, the following were chosen: Rachael Adams of Cinc. Mt. Notre Dame (attending Texas), Missy Harpenau of Cinc. Mother of Mercy (attending Cincinnati), Kayla Jeter of Solon (attending Tennessee), and Rachel Krabacher of Cinc. McAuley (attending Dayton)
- Jeremy Stober reminded the membership that all scholastic award nominations had to be postmarked by February 28th as well as coaching milestones and honors
- Volley for the Cure Coordinator, Stacie Whetstone, asked for coaches to have one of their athletes design a logo for 2008; the fan shirt was to be black with the logo in neon pink; a new tagline/slogan needed to be developed as well as including the Volley for the cure trademark, Susan G. Komen name, and the OHSVCA & OHSAA logos- due February 28
- The March Winter Work Session/Spring Meeting was hampered by a near blizzard snow 0 storm that allowed only eight board members to attend; the following items were covered: Treasurer Kaye Keller opened a checking account for the 25th Anniversary celebration using the CD set aside for this; Carol reported that our proposal for the 3 day state tournament (2 division semis on Thursday & Friday, all finals Saturday) was well received by the OHSAA and the vote concerning this ruling will be in April; report on Volley for the Cure- it is going national with each state working independently; can go to the Volley for the Cure website to set up on line donations; this year only numbered shirts with no logo for the players as per NFHS; player shirts can be donated; fan shirts must follow Koman regulations; Stacie Whetstone is our contact; AVCA partnership was well received and we are looking to lower the membership cost instead of a kickback to the OHSVCA; voted to lower AVCA membership cost to \$50.00; clinic gifts were decided upon as well as Banquet favors; name badges- one color, sweatshirt one color (only for pre-registration), and banquet one color; Sports Imports is providing the lanyard & badge holder; Max Preps wants to work with us and carry All-Ohio, stats, etc (Carol looking into this); computers and programs need to be upgraded for the officers and a printer needs to be purchases; Anita Jorney-Gifford said forms for the All-Star Match weekend could be filled out on line; Jayne Klingel will update schools and districts; Carol updated the board on the 25th (dvd will be made by Jeremy), need name badges for the President's Reception (Carol will do), limit of 250 persons, drink tickets until gone, then a cash bar, dinner- chicken parmeasan with food allergy/vegetarian choice (eggplant parmeasan), dancing, dj, cash bar after banquet, Jeremy & Cathy working on the dvd, Cathy to

prepare the agenda for MC Kathy DeBoer; Elite Camp is full and has a waiting list; there were several issues with the poll/all-star match that were discussed; SEI vote will occur by e-mail to Kathy Mercer; State Clinic- \$100 for clinic & membership, banquet \$10 additional, registration is on line and there is a late fee after July 11 (\$25), will start Saturday at 11:00 am, Doug Beal & Kathy DeBoer will each do a session; Molten contract will be up, recommend ball dealers to have pink/white vb available; Jeremy is working on things to improve the website- install a content management system, districts will be able to edit their pages, John is working well with Jeremy & will probably do a password protected membership & the CMA; camps can advertise on the web with fee of \$300; player scholarships will have to be voted on by e-mail; questions arose about when we would have our November meeting with the possibility of four matches on Thursdaydecision in August; major discussion on adding the position of Executive Directorrationale is to maintain and improve the level of the OHSVCA by overseeing the day to day operations due to our growth; duties, eligibility, attendance requirements, salary, & evaluation will be placed on the website for any interested applicants; president and treasurer are up for election in August

- The official ball of the OHSAA & OHSVCA for 2008-2009 was the Molten IV58L-U;
 balls had to have the OHSAA/OHSVCA logos on the ball; coaching and instruction could begin on August 4th, first match on August 23rd
- OHSVCA state clinic was to be held at <u>Westerville Central HS</u> on Friday, August 1st, and Saturday, August 2nd; main speakers would be Beth Launiere of the University of Utah, and Geoff Carlston of The Ohio State University; the clinic would again have the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting for volleyball coaches and officials & scorebooks and rulebooks would be available; Embassy Suites was once again the host hotel; Kathy Mercer was in charge of obtaining vendors for the clinic; all district trustees were responsible to get a \$25 door prize for the clinic; info about the clinic would be on the website; this clinic was special as it was also the 25th Anniversary of the OHSVCA (*further details are in the clinic section*)
- o Kathy Mercer prepared the flyer for the clinic and it went in the mail in early May
- In the 21st year of the Scholastic Awards program there were 830 individual varsity athletes honored representing 138 schools; 98 schools received their team certificates of honor at the clinic (74 varsity, 17 junior varsity, 4 freshmen, 3 jr. high/middleschools)
- o There were no candidates for the 2008 Lifetime Achievement Award

- The 2008 All-Star Match Weekend would return to Wooster HS, a 2 day celebration with practice and a banquet on Saturday (November 15) and the matches on Sunday (November 16); Anita Jorney-Gifford was once again the coordinator of the event
- Schools were encouraged to e-mail or call Dr. Moore at the OHSAA with any questions pertaining to uniforms, Federation rules, OHSAA rules on out-of-season play, camps, eligibility, etc.
- Scholarship winners for 2007-2008 were: Division I Sadie Schwarz, Fairfield HS; Division II – Molly Scholl, John Glenn HS; Division III – Ashley Claprood, Utica HS; Division IV – Abby Schroeder, Kalida HS; and the OHSVCA son/daughter winners were Emily Bowling, Symmes Valley HS and Megan Lilley of Canton Central Catholic HS; each winner received \$500.00
- Kathy Mercer, our SEI Coordinator to the OHSAA, announced the 2008 SEI
 Award winner for volleyball was Bill Buirley of Kettering Fairmont; his plaque was given to him at the OHSVCA All-Star Match/Hall of Fame Banquet
- At the clinic OHSVCA Board meeting, the following info was also approved/discussed 0 presented: Treasurer Kaye Keller reported at the end of July, there was \$84,000+ in our checking account, \$37,000+ in our savings account, and our CDs were cashed in for the anniversary (\$111,500+), after bills were paid for the 25th, the remaining money would go back into CDs to be held at a different bank than our checking/savings account; Vice-President Tracy Kornau recommended that if someone ran unopposed, that voting be allowed to occur at the August general meeting and that the time element to vote be changed; vice-president's office will be up for vote in 2009; Team Scholastic Awards were mailed to schools not at the clinic; there was lengthy discussion about the new Executive Director's position (duties and pay); 2 individuals applied (Chuck Braden and Carol Russo) and Carol Russo was selected; registering for the All-Star match would be done on line on C-Vent; Molten's contract was extended by the OHSVCA & the OHSAA, and they provided ball carts and the bags for the clinic; cost issues with the clinic badges by Sports Imports; Volley for the Cure t-shirts for the fans and officials would be black with neon pink logos; players would wear pink shirts with no logos/ sponsors on them to be in compliance with National Federation rules; matches could be held any time during the season; Kohlmer out of Lorain did the 25th Anniversary Banquet placemats, etc; American Dairy was providing pink bags for Volley for the Cure registered coaches; Ohio University coach filled in for Beth Launeire who left the clinic

- Tournament info and seeding for 2008 was to be found on the OHSAA website as well as Board of Control minutes; all districts were to have their draw meeting on a same universal date; volleyball records and statistics were being kept by the OHSAA and were unofficial; they had to be submitted by an athletic administrator or a media member or a fan with documentation to verify the validity of the record

- The OHSVCA once again had a Hospitality Room at the state tourney which was cosponsored by the OHSVCA, the Nutter Center and Molten USA; membership in the OHSVCA was required to enter; Final Four pins were given to teams, coaches, and officials at the captains conference during the semifinal matches at the State Tournament

THE STATE VOLLEYBALL COACHES CLINICS: 2003 -2008

- The Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee of the OHSAA organized and conducted the state volleyball clinics from 1973 to 1983
- The state rules interpretation meeting and a lunch were provided at the early clinics and have continued as a part of the clinics (if the clinic was in August/September)
- The clinic was a one day event from 1973 to 1979; in 1980, the format changed to a two day clinic to accommodate the need for more information and the different level of coaches in attendance
- ✤ In 1977, the state championship coaches were asked to begin speaking at the clinic
- The Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association have organized and conducted the state coaches clinics for volleyball since 1984
- The 2003 and 2008 clinics were significant in the fact they included a Friday night banquet to celebrate our 20th Anniversary (2003) and 25th Anniversary (2008) as a state coaches association
- The state volleyball coaches clinics has been one of the most well attended of the sport clinics in Ohio for the thirty five+ years of its existence

2003 – AUGUST 1st & AUGUST 2nd (Friday and Saturday)

Bob Price continued as the coordinator for the clinic, it was once again held at Westerville South HS; Laura Smith (Executive Secretary) handled the registration with help from Kaye Keller, Treasurer; the clinic once again offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Kim Berrington, head volleyball coach at Eastern Michigan University, and Judy Green of the University of Alabama; featured speakers were Sherri Sanders (USA National Team) and Elizabeth Zicha (Muskingum College), and Greg Myer of Sportsdynamics; Guidance Counselor, Julie Miller, spoke concerning the NCAA and advice to high school athletes; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership and the banquet) was \$100.00; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Dr. Deborah Moore of the OHSAA conducted the volleyball rules interpretation meeting; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; this clinic was different as it also included the 20th Anniversary Banquet at the Villa Milano Restaurant to celebrate the OHSVCA twenty years of existence; Jayne Klingel and Cathy Ames worked with Bob Price and Carol Russo to put the banquet together; the meal was an Italian style buffet dinner; OHSVCA past-presidents spoke and current coaches received their achievement awards at the banquet; a power point presentation of photos over the years was put together by Bunny Brooks

2004 – AUGUST 6th & AUGUST 7th (Friday and Saturday)

The clinic was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Jim Stone, head volleyball coach at The Ohio State University and his assistant, Steve Coulpus; featured speakers were Geoff Carlston (Ohio University), Sherri Sanders (USA National Team), Rich Zileski (OVR) and Dr. Elizabeth Zicha (Muskingum College); cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$100.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting (Dr. Deborah Moore) was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered;; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams

2005 – AUGUST 5TH AND AUGUST 6TH (Friday and Saturday)

The clinic was once again held at Westerville South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Ray Gooden, head volleyball coach at Northern Illinois University and Geoff Carlston, head volleyball coach at Ohio University; featured speakers were Sherri Sanders (setter, All-American at Cal State) and Stephanie Tracey, strength and conditioning coach at the University of Kentucky; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$100.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school advisory board provided increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; black backpacks, a 3 ring binder with the clinic handouts, and a golf wallet would be given to the attendees

2006 - AUGUST 4TH AND AUGUST 5TH (Friday and Saturday)

Clinic Coordinator Bob Price, had to move the clinic to Westerville Central HS due to renovations at South HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Rob Patrick, head volleyball coach at the University of Tennessee and Geoff Carlston of Ohio University; featured speakers were Sally Kus of Sweet Home HS, Stephanie Tracey of the University of Kentucky (weight training properly), Anne Kordes, St. Louis University (setter development), Paco Labrador of Wittenburg University, and the 2005 State Championship coaches ; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership) was \$100.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; there we emore sessions for junior high/middle school coaches and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; the attendees received various items including a padfolio and pens and pencils; social time was available once again on Friday evening at the Embassy Suites

2007 – AUGUST 3RD & 4TH (Friday and Saturday)

Bob Price, Clinic Coordinator for the OHSVCA, once again held the clinic at Westerville Central HS; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Cecile Reynaud, head volleyball coach at Florida State University, and Jim Stone of The Ohio State University; featured speakers were Dave Reinhart of Blackswamp Volleyball Club, Dr. Jennifer Carter and Dr. Sam Maniar, Sport Psychology at The Ohio State University, Steve Colpus, assistant from Ohio State University, Steve Aird, assistant at University of Cincinnati, Carol Russo and Mike Seibert, as well as state championship coaches; cost of the clinic (including yearly membership to the OHSVCA and the AVCA) was \$155.00; pre-registration to the clinic and yearly membership was \$100.00; the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; coaches received a Molten backpack w/ the OHSVCA logo, water bottle, travel mug, pink t-shirt to support Volley for the Cure, white and black notebooks with clinic handouts, and the usual pen and pencil

2008 – AUGUST 1st & 2nd (Friday and Saturday)

Kathy Mercer, Clinic Coordinator for the OHSVCA (with a little help from Bob Price!), once again held the clinic at Westerville Central HS; Mark Williams was assisting Kathy Mercer with the clinic; the clinic offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Beth Launiere, head volleyball coach at the University of Utah, and Geoff Carlston of The Ohio State University; featured speakers were Doug Beal, CEO of USA Volleyball, Steve Yarnell of Bluffton University, Paco Labrador of Wittenburg University, Stephanie Tracey-Simmons of the University of Kentucky, Kathy DeBoer, Executive Director of the AVCA, and state championship coaches; cost of the clinic varied based upon your attendance at the banquet and the membership package you chose (OHSVCA and/or AVCA) the OHSAA rules interpretation meeting was available for coaches and officials; a general session of the OHSVCA as well as a poll voters meeting were held at the clinic; weight training, sports medicine/CPR certification were offered; Junior high/middle school increased sessions for that level and a scrimmage board was included for all teams; coaches received a computer bag w/ the OHSVCA logo from Molten, an umbrella, white and black notebooks with clinic handouts, and the usual pen and pencil,; this clinic was very special since it was celebrating our 25th as an association; we were honored to have Kathy DeBoer as our master of ceremony and Doug Beal as our keynote speaker ("Amazing Awaits"); Carol Russo and officers worked very diligently to put the Banquet together (Embassy Suites) which included a President's Reception followed by the 25th Anniversary Banquet/Celebration on Friday night; guests included OHSVCA past presidents (Grace Hutchinson and Chuck Braden), original trustees and coordinators; the OHSAA was represented by Dr. Deborah Moore (Assistant Commissioner), clinician Beth Launiere (Utah), Melissa Dawson, President of Molten USA, and Mark Watson, cofounder of Sports Imports; Cathy Ames worked with Jeremy Stober in putting together a dvd that was shown at the banquet; favors were a Topper soft cooler and lunch bag with our logo/25th

- All schools were/are eligible for the OHSAA Volleyball tournaments as long as they were in good standing with the OHSAA
- ✓ In 1990, the tournament switched from a three class system to four divisions with Division I consisting of the large schools and Division IV consisting of the small schools
- ✓ A school's division was determined by the number of girls in the 9th, 10th, and 11th grades from the previous school year (the method to determine class had been based upon the upper three grades for a period of time)
- ✓ Advancement through the tournament trail was/is as follows: the sectional tournament, the district tournament, the regional tournament (also called the "Sweet Sixteen"); and the state tournament (Final Four)
- ✓ The tournaments are all single elimination tournaments
- \checkmark Seeding for the top teams occurs only at the Sectional level
- ✓ The sectional and district tournaments are conducted by the six district boards in the state (Central, Eastern, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, and Southwest); the regional and state tournaments are under control of the OHSAA
- ✓ Teams were allowed to dress **fifteen** academically eligible players for the tournaments; those fifteen could change throughout the tournament as long as they were academically eligible
- ✓ The first state tournament ticket cost \$2.00, the program .50 cents (1975); in 1990 the programs cost rose to \$2.00 and stayed at that price through 2002; cost to attend the 1990 1992 state tournaments was \$5.00 per session; in 2003 the cost of the program was raised to \$3.00; cost of the 2004 state tournament was \$7.00 per session; in 2005, the cost was \$9.00 per session or \$7.00 presale for participating schools; in 2008, cost of each session was \$9.00 and the cost of the program was \$4.00
- ✓ The 1990 State Volleyball Tournament Program carried a picture of Dolores Billhardt and information about the Memorial Scholarship set up in her name
- ✓ The 1984 state tournament was the last one to be held at Otterbein College, as the attendance had outgrown the Rike Center; Dr. Jo Ann Tyler had been in charge of the first nine tournaments; in 1985, the tournament moved to the The Ohio State University, St. John Arena for one year with Dr. Phyllis Bailey the tournament manager
- ✓ After 1985, the tournament moved to the University of Dayton with Dr. Elaine Dreidame acting as the tournament manager; the tournament was held at UD through 1990

- ✓ In 1991, the State Volleyball Tournament was moved to Wright State University, the Nutter Center, and Peggy Wynkoop was the tournament manager through 1994; Fred Durkle was tourney manager in 1995 and Peggy Wynkoop returned as manager in 1996 and 1997 because of Mr. Durkle's passing; the tournament has stayed at WSU through 2008 and Max Benton has been the tourney host since 1998
- ✓ In 1990, all semi-finals were played on Thursday and Friday and all finals were played on Saturday due to the switch to divisions (eight matches for the semis and four for the finals)
- ✓ In 1990, the Thursday matches were played at 7:30 and 9:15 p.m. (Division IV); the Friday matches were played at 10:00 and 11:45 a.m. (Division III), 2:00 and 3:45 p.m. (Division II), 6:30 and 8:15 p.m. (Division I); on Saturday, the finals occurred as follows: Division IV at 10:00 a.m., Division III at 12:30 p.m., Division II at 3:30 p.m., and Division I at 6:00 p.m.
- ✓ In 1991, slight adjustments were made on the starting times of the matches, and the divisions were then rotated each year so the same divisions were not always playing first on Thursday or last on Saturday
- ✓ The 2004 tournament marked the first state tourney played under rally scoring rules; because of the imability to predict starting times after the first semifinal match(es), times were not assigned; Thursday evening the first Division I match started at 6:00 with the second semi to begin 30 minutes after the end of the previous match; on Friday, Division IV started at 11:00 am followed by Division III and then Division II (needless to say, it was a late night); the finals on Saturday were assigned starting times with Division I played at 11:00 am, Division IV at 1:30 pm, Division III at 4:00 pm, and Division II at 7:00 pm; the rolling time schedule continued in the following years of 2005-2007
- ✓ The 2006 state tournament also was a time of recognition for the OHSAA; this was their 100th year of service to Ohio and part of their celebration included recognizing many of the highly successful volleyball state championship coaches before the finals of their respective divisions; many of the coaches brought one of their student/athletes with them to enjoy this honor
- ✓ The OHSAA made a very important change to the 2008 State Tournament: there would be two divisions playing their semi-finals on Thursday and the other two divisions would play their semi-finals on Friday; all division finals would be played on Saturday

A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE MAJOR

RULES AND REGULATIONS IN VOLLEYBALL 2003 -2008 (National Federation Rules and the Ohio High School Athletic Association)

- In 1974, the state of Ohio switched from the DGWS Rulebook for Volleyball to the National Federation of State High School Associations edition of volleyball rules
- The rules of the National Federation will be indicated with a **checkmark** and come from the front of each of the rulebooks to indicate major rule changes for that year
- Rules and regulations of the OHSAA will be indicated with an **arrow**
- In 1984, the Publicity Chairman for Ohio was Hank Zaborniak, Jr. He was in charge of spreading information pertaining to officials and the officiating program in Ohio to the entire nation
- Rules interpreters were Deborah Moore, Steve Trout, Diane Plas, and Keith Fisher
- The NFHS began sending a Volleyball Guide booklet for the officials; it was published by Referee Enterprises, Inc. in cooperation with the NFHS

2003: Sheryl Solberg was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 59; the case book was 94 pages long

- ✓ Effective no later than 2004-2005 the scoring format shall be rally scoring, with the following components:
 - 3 out of 5 games
 - 25 point games (no cap)
 - 15 point deciding game (no cap)
 - include a let serve
 - 2 time outs per game (no extra time out during 'overtime')

<u>Rationale</u>- scoring preference for high school volleyball (I will mention at this time that Ohio was one of the last states to adopt rally scoring)

- ✓ Upon entering the facility, the home team shall select its team bench
 <u>Rationale</u>- encourages good sportsmanship by pre-determining the bench
- ✓ The visiting captain shall call the toss and the winner chose either to serve or receive <u>Rationale</u>- encourages good sportsmanship by pre-determining the caller

- The home captain called the coin toss for the deciding game of a match; the winner got to choose serve, receive, or side of court; the loser of the toss was given the remaining choice
 <u>Rationale</u>- pre-determining who called the toss in the deciding game kept the flow and order of all matches consistent
- Players were not to wear jewelry during pre-match warm-ups (except religious or medical medals taped to the body under the uniform) as well as the match
 <u>Rationale</u>- rule compliance for no jewelry during competition as well as warm-ups
- ✓ Uniforms were to be worn as intended by the manufacturers <u>Rationale</u>- consistent with uniform restrictions in other rule codes
- ✓ Placed so the top of the number on the front of the uniform is no more than 5 inches down from the shoulder seam; or placed so the number is entered no more than 2 inches below the neckline opening on the upper body or no more than 2 inches below the bottom edge of the neckline ribbing on the uniform top

<u>Rationale</u>-uniform sales personnel indicated the manufacturers cannot place a number 2 inches from the neckline opening because of the ribbing around the neckline opening

- ✓ A live ball becomes dead when an official's whistle sounds
 <u>Rationale</u>- clarified the ball is dead when an inadvertent whistle on that court sounded
- A live ball becomes dead when a timer's audio signal interrupts play
 <u>Rationale</u>- clarified that the ball is dead when an inadvertent time-out on that court sounded
- Multiple contacts are more than one contact by a player during one attempt to play the ball.
 Multiple contacts are permitted only on any first team hit, whether or not the ball is touched by the block

<u>Rationale</u>- deleted the "provided there is no finger action" from the existing rule. "Finger action" was open to a multitude of interpretations and made for inconsistent application

✓ Play continues when a back-row player, (on or in front of the attack line), contacts the ball, which is completely above the height of the net, on the team's first or second contact, directing flight of the ball toward a teammate and the opponent legally contacts the ball that breaks the vertical plane of the net. If the net is hit into a back-row player, it is ruled as the team's first hit/contact. It is a back-row player foul if the flight of the ball is toward the opponent's court and not toward a teammate and is legally touched by an opponent above the net or completely crosses the net

<u>Rationale</u>- removed the need for an official to judge the intent of the back-row player by judging the direction of the ball

 Effective 2004 with rally scoring... a ball contacting and crossing the net shall remain in play provided contact is entirely within the net antennas
 Detionale the rale change have a because response to the rale change all entire contacting and crossing the rate of th

<u>Rationale</u>- the rule change became necessary to support the rule change allowing continuation of play on a net serve (let serve)

- The substitute enters or a player leaves the court before the umpire directs them to do so <u>Rationale</u>- the official is to release a player into the court after confirming the readiness of the scorer
- ✓ Charged time-outs begin when the official recognizes the request with the whistle and signal. A time-out will last for a maximum of 60 seconds or less if both teams are ready to play Rationale- consistent administration of time-outs
- ✓ Disrespectfully addressing, baiting or taunting anyone involved in the contest <u>Rationale</u>- modification would conform to the spirit of sportsmanship. Coaches, for example, have been known to disrespectfully address their own players, and therefore, could be penalized

In 2003 - 04, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Officials needed to take their bar-coded card to the state meeting for verification of attendance
- > Officials no longer needed to self nominate for the OHSAA tournaments
- Officials needed to wear a solid white polo style shirt purchased from an authorized OHSAA supplier
- Persons interested in becoming an OHSAA registered volleyball official were required to complete an initial adult education course

2004: Sheryl Solberg was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 58; the case book was 95 pages long

- ✓ A match would consist of the best three-out-of-five games; the first team to win three games was the winner of the match and the fourth and fifth games were not to be played unless it was necessary to determine the winner of the match
- \checkmark A match was to include the let serve
- ✓ A match would have 2 time outs per game

- ✓ By state high school association adoption, teams could play a best two-of-three game match in which a team is considered the winner of the match when it wins two games; all games were to be 25 points with no cap; the third game was not to be played unless it was necessary to determine the winner; if a third game was necessary, a coin toss would be conducted prior to that game
- \checkmark The conference was to be conducted with the head coach and...
- \checkmark Deleted- officials would stop play when a player broke the plane of a nonplayable area
- Players could play a ball over a non-playable area if they had a body part in contact with a
 playable area at the time the ball was contacted; during the follow through, the could enter a nonplayable area after playing the ball
- ✓ The net support included attachments to the net, walls or upright standards as well as any attachment used for anchoring the standards to the floor, walls, or ceiling
- ✓ The ball was to be spherical with a laceless molded cover of 12 or more pieces all of which were to be white genuine or simulated smooth...
- ✓ The official's uniform was to consist of an all-white, short-sleeved, collared polo shirt, black slacks, solid black athletic shoes and black socks (to be effective 05-06)
- ✓ Deleted- if games were tied at 14-14, notify the coach that he/she has an additional time-out <u>Rationale</u>- NFHS rules do not allow additional time-outs during extended games
- \checkmark Signal at the completion of a charged time-out, how many time-puts each team had used
- ✓ During time-outs, line judges were to stand at the intersection of the attack line and the sideline on their respective side of the court nearest the referee; the line judge on the serving team's side of the net was to hold the match ball
- An exceptional substitution was to count as a team substitution if the team had not exhausted its 18 team substitutions
- ✓ Deleted- an additional time-out...
- ✓ Official's Manual- the Begin Serve Signal: extend the arm toward the serving team's side of the net, blow the whistle to begin serve and move the extended hand and arm in a sweeping motion to the opposite shoulder
- The authorization to enter was a new signal for the umpire as well as the view of play blocked signal for the line judges
- ✓ Official's Manual-deleted marking the server on the lineup card...

- In 2004 05, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:
 - Officials needed to take their bar-coded card to the state meeting for verification of attendance
 - > Officials no longer needed to self nominate for the OHSAA tournaments
 - Officials needed to wear a solid white polo style shirt purchased from an authorized OHSAA supplier
 - Persons interested in becoming an OHSAA registered volleyball official were required to complete an initial adult education course
 - Officials received a handout on "Introduction to Rally Scoring" and "The Libero Experiment-Basic Operating Rules- 2004"

2005: Gina Mazzolini was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, transitioning to libero player, code of ethics for coaches and officials, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 57; the case book was 95 pages long

- ✓ The officials uniform would be an all-white, short sleeve collared polo shirt, black slacks, and solid black athletic shoes and black shoes; NOTE: by state high school association adoption, official uniforms could be modified
- ✓ The requirement of the umpire to record illegal player equipment, uniform warnings, penalties and disqualifications for unsportsmanlike conduct on the lineup card was deleted
- ✓ If the ball was hit back into a backrow player whose hands are below the height of the net, it was ruled as the team's first hit/contact
- ✓ The line violation signal for the official was changed from an open hand to pointing a finger at the line
- ✓ Optional for 2005-06 and effective in 2006-07: the libero is a backrow player and can not complete an attack from anywhere if, at the moment of contact, the ball is entirely above the height of the net; only one libero per game
- ✓ The libero: had to be designated on the lineup sheet prior to each game, must enter the game after starting lineup had been checked, could only exercise one replacement per dead ball, must enter and exit game between the attack line and the endline, could be the team captain, could be used as an exceptional substitution for an injured player if no other legal substitutes were available, could not replace a disqualified teammate, could not block or attempt to block, could

not serve, could not set the ball using overhand finger action while in front of the attack line extended, for an attack above the height of the net

- ✓ Points of emphasis included the net serve signal, the importance of warm-up, use of the lineup card, and changes in signals for a down ball
- In 2005 06, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:
 - Officials could wear black shorts, white shoes and socks
 - Officials and coaches received a manual from the OHSAA in their rulebook packet which included information on rules interpretation meetings, volleyball modifications and interpretations, information about rally scoring, the coaching bench experiment, information for officials about uniforms, etc., regulations for volleyball and general sport regulations, rule changes, major editorial changes and Ohio experiments, sporting conduct, information about the OHSAA and OHSVCA, volleyball links, frequently asked questions, calendars, and officials local associations

2006: Gina Mazzolini was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, explanations dealing with the libero(tracking, further explanation of the rules for this player), code of ethics for coaches and officials, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 63; the case book was 96 pages long

- Clarified that the centerline court marking could be a shadow line to designate the two inch centerline
- ✓ The cables used to retract a ceiling-suspended net system (located on one side of the net) were considered to be playable overhead obstructions
- ✓ The placement of numbers on the center front of the uniform top could be located no more than 5 inches below the bottom edge of any neckline, ribbing, placket or seam
- ✓ The rules relating to the libero were changed to place the items in more appropriate sections of the rules; further clarification had been included in the rules in incorporate uniform numbering, location of libero movement at the moment of the serve, and game administration and penalties involving unnecessary delay
- Specified the umpire was to verify that the lineup had been entered correctly on the scoresheet by the official scorer

- ✓ Officially added the position of the assistant scorer (libero tracker); responsibility was to record libero replacements; location at scorer's table was next to the official scorer
- ✓ Any player designated as the libero was to identified on the team roster; the libero could be listed with two numbers with the first as the non-libero number and the second as the libero number; the libero number could not be a duplicate of any other player on the roster
- ✓ Definition of a block was changed to having a player close to the net who is reaching higher than the net and deflects the ball coming from an opponent; block attempt, completed block, and collective block were defined; backrow players could not complete a block or collective block
- \checkmark Specified during play those player actions that were not legal for the libero
- Clarified and defined within the rules when, how and where a libero replacement would take place, when the replacement was illegal, redesignation of the libero, proper procedures for handling exceptional substitutions and disqualifications involving the libero
- ✓ Allowed the head coach to stand in the libero replacement zone during any dead ball to instruct his/her players; the privilege was lost and the head coach had to remain seated if a card was issued to anyone on the team bench
- ✓ Major editorial changes and points of emphasis were listed
- In 2006 07, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:
 - Officials could wear black shorts, white shoes and socks
 - Officials and coaches received a manual from the OHSAA in their rulebook packet which included information on rules interpretation meetings, volleyball modifications and interpretations, information about rally scoring, information for officials about uniforms, etc., regulations for volleyball and general sport regulations, rule changes, major editorial changes and Ohio experiments, sporting conduct, information about the OHSAA and OHSVCA, volleyball links, frequently asked questions, calendars, medical & safety reference information, OHSAANET directions, tournament entry protocol, and officials local associations

2007: Gina Mazzolini was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, explanations dealing with the libero(tracking, further explanation of the

rules for this player), code of ethics for coaches and officials, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, various advertising, and the index to rules; number of pages- 80; the case book was 99 pages long

- Clarified when music and sould effects could be used and prohibited the use of artificial noisemakers at all times
- ✓ Jewelry was prohibited to be worn during warm-ups and competition; if seen during warm-ups, no penalty would be issued unless the player refused to remove the item
- ✓ Bare midriff tops were prohibited and the uniform top needed to be tucked in or hang below the waistband of the uniform bottom
- ✓ More that one solid color could be used in the trim surrounding the uniform number; the trim or the body of the number needed to be in sharp contrast to the color of the uniform top to make it clearly visible
- ✓ Further clarified the restrictions of officials using electronic devices to make decisions on the game
- ✓ Beginning with 2009-10, state associations would not be allowed to modify officials' uniforms
- ✓ State Associations could permit the wearing of black shorts to address heat related issues
- \checkmark Rules were adjusted to allow the libero to serve
- The penalty for an illegal libero replacement found in the game would be a loss of rally/point and considered an illegal alignment
- Reguirement for the method submitting the lineup was changed to a listing of the uniform number of the starting players in proper serving order and no longer used a player floor postion method
- ✓ Libero replacement could not take place during a re-serve
- ✓ A backrow player was treated the same no matter what the circumstances; it is illegal anytime for a backrow player that is on or in front of the attack line to contact the ball completely above the height of the net and complete an attack
- \checkmark Conditions for the coach to stand during the match were entirely listed in rule 12-2,5 and 6
- \checkmark The libero replacement was to be completed prior to the whistle and signal for serve
- ✓ The libero replacement could take place once a time-out was completed and all players had returned to the court
- ✓ Clarified the penalties for an illegal libero replacement entering the game as an unnecessary delay and if found in the game after the whistle/signal for serve as an illegal alignment (loss of rally/point)

- ✓ The libero could serve and replace the player in the right back position and serve the next rally without having to sit out one diead ball
- Specified the head coach had to be seated once the referee extended his/her arm in preparation to whistle/signal for serve
- ✓ Change in official's mechanics- the mechanics and point signal were changed to indicate point and team to have the next serve to extending the arm in the direction of the team that would serve; palm would be perpendicular to the floor
- ✓ Major editorial changes and points of emphasis were listed
- In 2007 08, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:
 - Officials could wear black shorts, white shoes and socks during the regular season, but in tournaments had to wear black slacks
 - > There was no longer a 'retired status' for volleyball officials
 - Officials and coaches received a manual from the OHSAA in their rulebook packet which included information on rules interpretation meetings, volleyball modifications and interpretations, information about rally scoring, information for officials about uniforms, etc., regulations for volleyball and general sport regulations, rule changes, major editorial changes and Ohio experiments, sporting conduct, information about the OHSAA and OHSVCA, Volley for the Cure, volleyball links, frequently asked questions, calendars, medical & safety reference information, OHSAANET directions, tournament entry protocol, and officials local associations

2008: Gina Mazzolini was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, rationale for major rule revisions, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, explanations dealing with the libero(tracking, further explanation of the rules for this player), code of ethics for coaches and officials, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, various advertising, and the index to rules; number of pages- 80; the case book was 100 pages long

Prior to the timed warm-ups, a conference was conducted with the head coach and captain(s) from each team

- ✓ A name change- replacement of all references to referee with first referee and replace all references to umpire with second referee
- \checkmark By state high school association adoption, line judges could use flags
- ✓ Major editorial changes and points of emphasis were listed

In 2008 – 09, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Officials could wear black shorts, white shoes and socks during the regular season, but in tournaments had to wear black slacks; Ohio would change to black shoes and socks in 2009-2010
- Officials and coaches received a manual from the OHSAA in their rulebook packet which included information on rules interpretation meetings, volleyball modifications and interpretations, Ohio match limitations, information for officials about uniforms, etc., regulations for volleyball and general sport regulations, rule changes, major editorial changes and Ohio experiments, sporting conduct, information about the OHSAA and OHSVCA, Volley for the Cure, volleyball links, frequently asked questions, calendars, medical & safety reference information, OHSAANET directions, and tournament entry protocol
- Rulebook packets also included (and had for several years) a Preseason Guide from the NFHS and the Handbook for Officials; during the course of the year, officials also received the Officials' Quarterly, The Magazine for High School Officials
