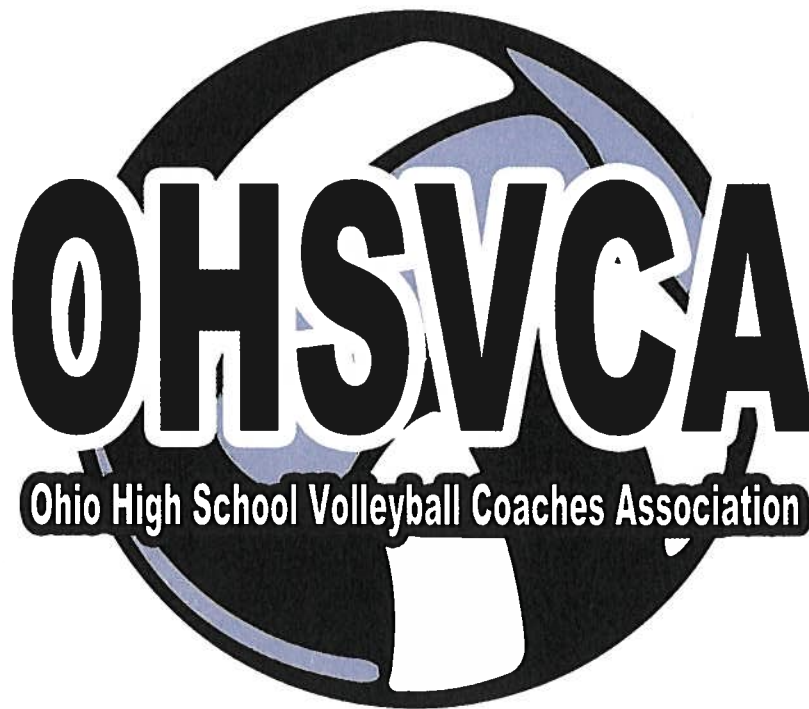

Welcome to the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association All-Star matches. This 42<sup>nd</sup> annual contest features 80 of the best high school volleyball athletes from every area of the state, as well as eight of the top coaches, as selected by their peers.

The Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association (OHSVCA) takes great pride in presenting this event. Nearly all of Ohio's secondary schools now sponsor interscholastic volleyball programs. The formation of the OHSVCA in 1983, by a group of concerned coaches, has become recognized as a significant factor in the future of the sport in the Buckeye State. In addition to this All-Star event, the OHSVCA is responsible for the Ohio Top 20 Volleyball Prep Poll (carried statewide by local newspapers), the All-Ohio Player Selections, and the Coach of the Year awards. Additionally, the OHSVCA recognizes excellence in academics through Scholarship Team Champions, the Individual Scholar/Athlete Awards for athletes carrying a 3.5 GPA or higher, the OHSVCA Scholarship Award in each division as well as two scholarships for the children of member coaches. The OHSVCA Camp, the Media Award, and awarding of the Final Four pins at the annual State tournament also fall under our auspice.

It is the belief of the OHSVCA membership that if the sport is to continue to develop, we must have the best possible players, coaches, administrators, and spectators. We must establish good public relations and media coverage. Volleyball can and should be a very rewarding and enjoyable activity and the benefits from participation in it should be available to all.

### **All-Star Team Selection**

There are 16 OHSVCA districts in Ohio, each of which is represented by a District Volleyball Coaches Organization. Each district selects one Player of the Year from each division. The senior POYs are invited to participate in the OHSVCA All-Star Match. If the district POY is not a senior, the coaches select a senior representative to the all-star match. Rosters are then completed with senior All-Ohioans in vote order and with position consideration.

### **Coaches Selection**

The coaches in today's matches were selected from the statewide All-Ohio balloting for Coach of the Year. The top two vote-getters who have not coached in the previous two years were asked to coach the State All-Star Teams.

## **OHSVCA Lifetime Achievement Award**

### ***Janet Day***

It is with great pleasure that the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association announces Janet Day as a 2023 recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award. Coach Day was the former head volleyball coach at Eastern (Beaver) High School. She has a career record of 405 wins and 69 losses over a 19-year career as head coach. She also served two years as a JV Coach at Eastern.

Janet graduated from Eastern High School and Rio Grande University where she received a Bachelor's Degree in Health and Physical Education. She and her husband Rob Day reside in Beaver, OH and have three children; son Robie (Mandy) Day and two daughters, Rebecca (Kevin) Greene and Rhyanna (Bruce) Knauff. She has 5 grandchildren; Madilen, Matthew and Anna Day, Tytus and Cora Greene.

During her career she was awarded the OHSVCA Coach of the Year in 2008, OHSVCA Coaches Achievement Award in 2004 and 2012, District 14 Coach of the Year (5 times) and SOC I Coach of the Year (14 times). In 2012 she was selected to coach at the OHSVCA State All-Star Match.

Under her leadership Eastern High School won 1 Regional Championship (Final Four appearance), 5 regional Runner-Up titles, 10 District Championships, 8 District Runner-Up titles, 18 SOC Championships, 19 Sectional Championships, finished top10 in the coaches poll 10 times, and won the Pike Co. Tournament 8 times.

Coach Day is a lifetime member of the OHSVCA and served 5 years as the Secretary of District 14. She ran the Eastern Pee Wee volleyball program for 15 years and coached for SOVC club volleyball for 6 years where her team won the OVR regional championship.

### ***Bob Fawcett***

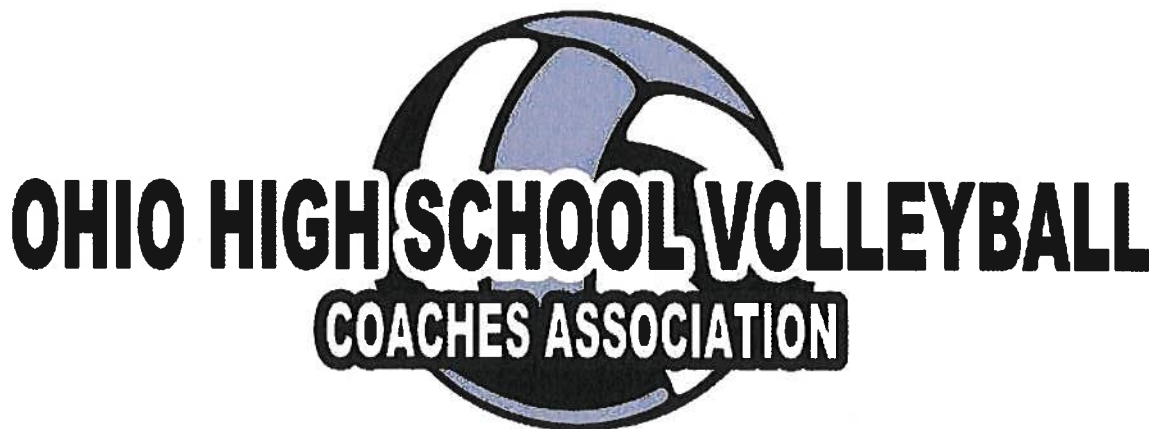

Coach Fawcett was the former head volleyball coach at Benjamin Logan High School. His career record stands at 199 wins and 121 losses following a 15 year career as head coach.

Bob was born in Rushsylvania, Ohio and graduated from Benjamin Logan High School, Urbana University and Wright State University. He and his wife, Kim Fawcett, reside in Zanesfield and have a daughter, Nicole Fawcett, and a son and daughter-in-law, Joe (Katie) Fawcett.

During his career, coach Fawcett was awarded West Central Ohio Conference Volleyball Coach of the Year 4 times, the CBC Coach of the Year 3 times, OHSVCA Coaches Achievement Award twice (2003 & 2004), District IX Division II Volleyball Coach of the Year, and 2004 Division II Volleyball Coach of the Year. His teams won 5 conference championships, 3 sectional titles, and 1 district title while finishing as regional runner up in 2004.

Coach Fawcett was a 15-year member of the OHVCA. He attended many state clinics and district meetings during his coaching career and was a presenter at the OHSVCA clinic on the topic of college recruiting. Bob organized, led, and conducted volleyball clinics for youth in the Logan County area at the Hilliker YMCA. He started the Mad River JO volleyball club in the early 90's and helped coach at Team Atlantis JO club.

### ***Chris Leuthold***

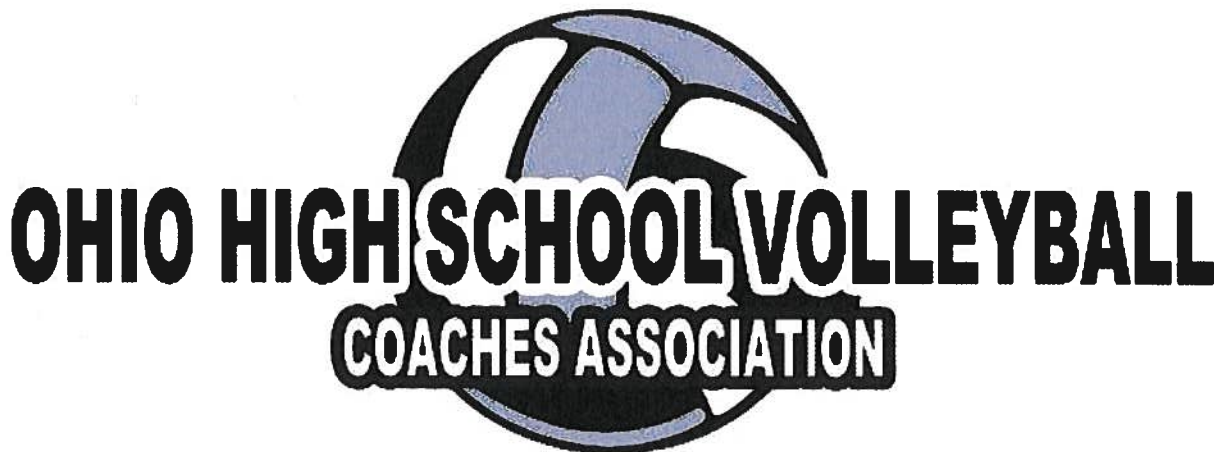
It is with great pleasure that the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association announces Chris Leuthold as a 2023 recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award. Coach Leuthold was the head volleyball coach at Cory-Rawson High School from 1980-2007. After a 15- year retirement, he returned this season as head coach and took a team that had won 1 game the previous two seasons to an 8-15 record. His career record stands at 276 wins and 329 losses following a 29-year career as head coach.

Chris was born in Wauseon, OH and graduated from Ayersville High School. He graduated with a B.S. degree from Ashland University and a M.A degree from Bowling Green State University. He currently resides in Findlay, OH.

During his career, coach Leuthold was honored as the Blanchard Valley Coach of the Year in 1985 and received the *Sportsmanship, Ethics, and Integrity award* from the OHSVCA in 2004. He was also selected to coach the District 8 All Star match several times. He has passed his love of coaching and teaching on to his players. Thirty-four of his former players have moved on to coach teams of their own, and 29 of his players have pursued a teaching career.

Coach Leuthold is a lifetime member of the OHSVCA and has attended the coaches clinic for 30 years. He served as a presenter at the clinic in 1987. On the local level, he has served as president for both District 8 and the Blanchard Valley Conference Volleyball Coaches Association. He initiated the Cory-Rawson Invitation Tournament and has been a guest speaker at many volleyball officials' classes.

### ***Betsy Smerglia***

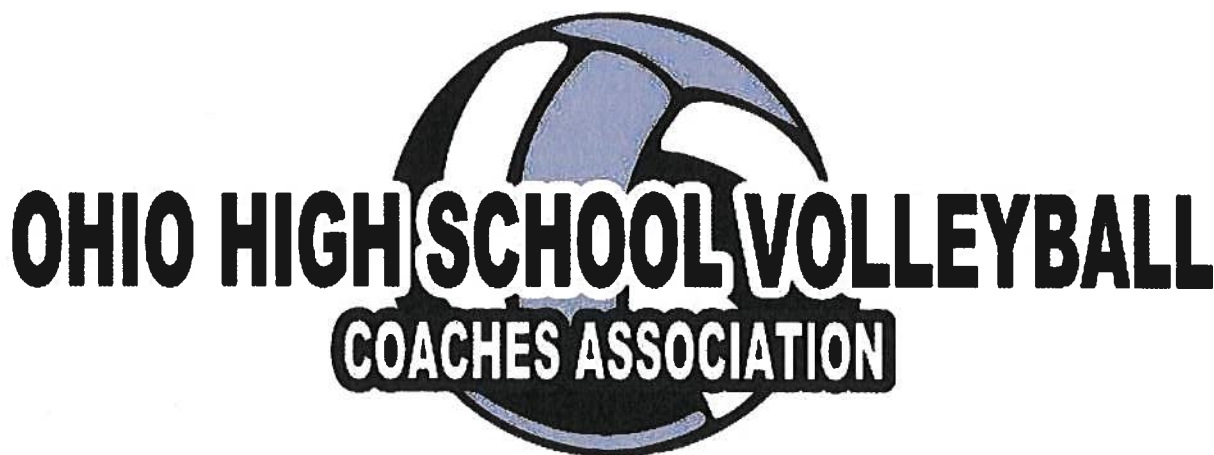

## ***Diana Kramer New Bremen High School***

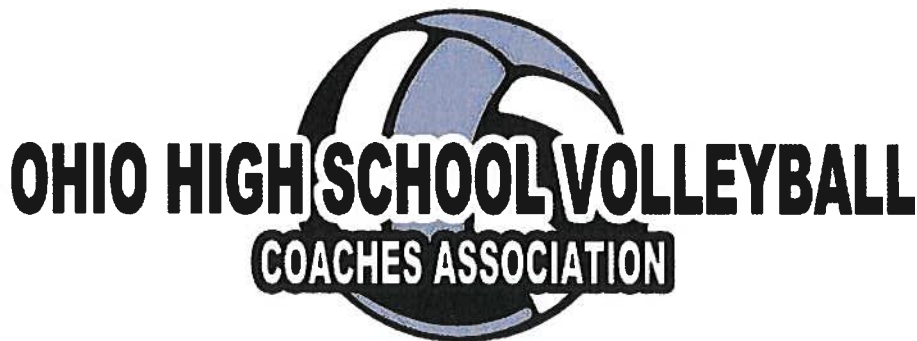

## **2023 OHSVCA Hall of Fame Award Honoree**

### ***Sherril K. Appelfeller Elgin High School***

It is with great pleasure that the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association announces the 2023 Hall of Fame induction of Sherril K. Appelfeller, Former Head Volleyball Coach at Elgin High School (Marion County). Coach Appelfeller led the Comets to a 362-131 record over a total of 22 years as head coach (1989-2007, 2014-15). They won 11 straight MOAC Titles from 1995-2006, played in 8 Central District Finals matches, made 7 regional appearances, and made it to the Final Four (Division 3) 4 times including two State Runner-Up Titles in 1995 and 1997.

Sherril was born in Kenton, OH to parents Kenneth and Mary Alice Converse. She attended Bowling Green State University. She and her husband Andy have enjoyed their three children, Ben, Jonathan, and Jennifer, as well as their 9 grandchildren.

During her career she received the NFHS Ohio Coach of the Year Award in 2003. She was awarded the OHSVCA Division 3 Coaches Achievement Award 5 times (1996, 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001), and Central District Division 3 Coach of the Year 6 times (1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2005). She was selected to coach the OHSVCA State All-Star Match for Division 3 in 1996 and 2000. She retired as a teacher from Elgin High School in 2007 after 35 years.

Sherril was a 25-year member of the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association. Since retiring from coaching, she has been giving back to the game by serving as a volleyball official for 14 years.

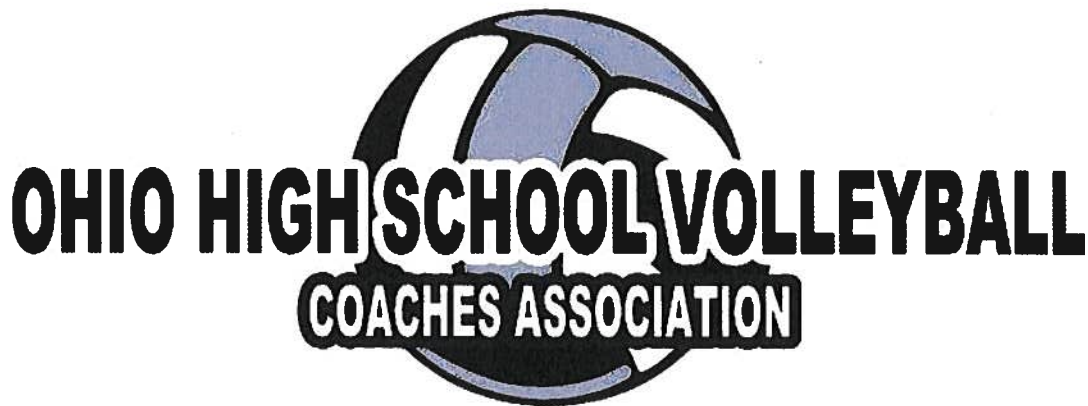
### ***Cheryl Jones Otsego High School***

It is with great pleasure that the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association announces the 2023 Hall of Fame induction of Cheryl Jones, former head volleyball coach at Otsego High School (Tontogany). Coach Jones led Otsego to a 485-320 record over a total of 33 years as head coach (1986-2019). Her League record was 330 wins and 160 losses. ### ***Lisa Thobe*** ***New Bremen High School***

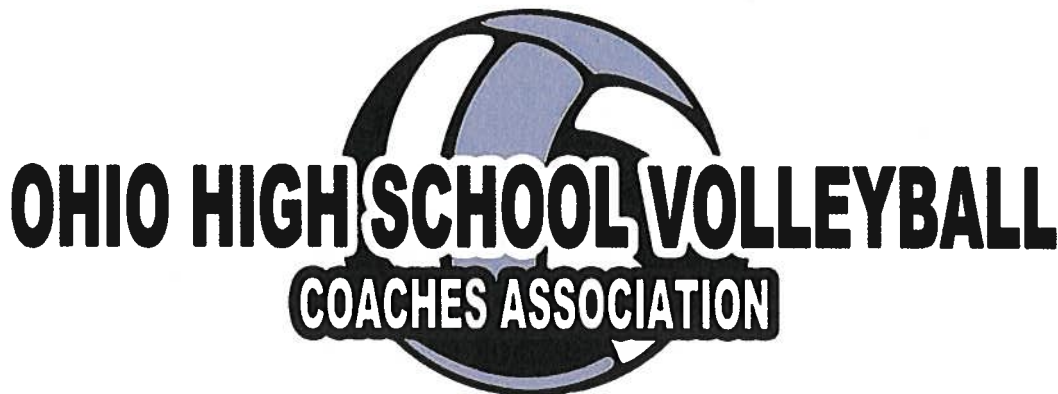

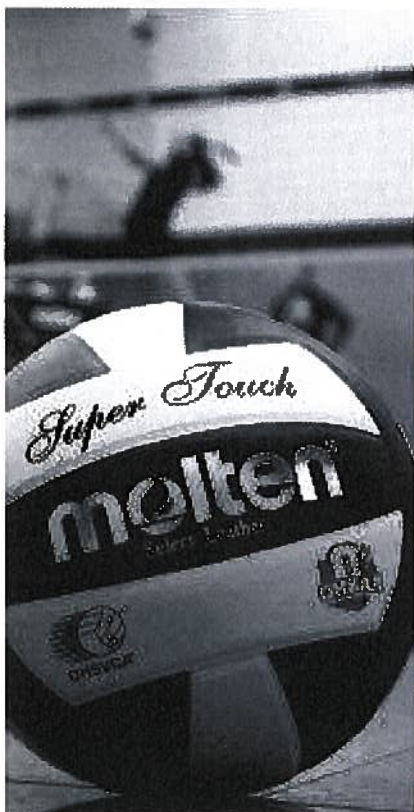
