- Interviews of different individuals around the state concerning volleyball; people interviewed included: Charlotte Basnett (first OHSVCA Executive Secretary), Chuck Braden (New Knoxville), Lucille Burkett (Shaker Heights, DGWS Chair), Hildred Byrkett (Troy), Chuck Dorsey (Jackson), Rod Ebright (Grandview Heights & Sports Imports), Dorothy Edwards (Elida), Diana Ford (Bexley), Lois Harkins (Federal Hocking), Randy Heath (Jackson Journal Herald), Margaret “Peg” Love (Department of Education), Bob MacFarland (Stow), Carol Mertler (Ashland College), Radonna Miller (Upper Arlington), Dr. Deborah Moore (OHSAA), “Bernie” Reinhardt (Lima Shawnee), Char Sharp (Archbold), Agnes Timmons (Barnesville), Dr. Jo Ann Tyler (Otterbein College), and Lori Wagner (Mansfield). **If you know of someone I should interview, please let me know! I recently interviewed Sue Brady of Oberlin High School & Kathleen Harris of West Holmes High School.** Coach Brady started teaching in 1958 at Oberlin and began the girls’ athletic programs at that school. Coach Harris began the girls’ athletic program in the 60’s as well. It was a complete joy to listen to their memories!!!
- Books written about volleyball and various volleyball magazines
- The OHSAA office and past issues of their magazine, THE BULLETIN (1922-1940) and THE ATHLETE (1941-present); also booklets dealing with girls’ sports such as “Guidelines for Girls’ Sports Programs in Ohio” (1970); and the State Volleyball Tournament programs
- My own files, which included information about the Girls’ Volleyball Advisory Committee, the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association including the OHSVCA newsletters and All-Star programs, the National Federation rule books, and bulletins from the OHSAA office
- The national office of the National Association for Girls’ & Women in Sports and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance for rule books, and other pieces of pertinent information

- Donated material from various individuals such as Diana Ford, Margaret Love, and Chuck Braden

The goal of this paper is to provide a background regarding the growth of the sport of volleyball in Ohio and to record major information of the OHSVCA. It will be presented during the summers of 2004 through 2008, the OHSVCA's 25th anniversary.

A BRIEF REVIEW OF THE BEGINNING YEAR OF 1983

THE OHIO HIGH SCHOOL VOLLEYBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION

- ❖ The beginning of the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association came about primarily as a challenge from Dolores Billhardt (she knew that more coaches involved would provide a greater voice for volleyball to the OHSAA)
- ❖ Rod Ebright, Chuck Braden, and members of the Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee got the ball rolling after the November, 1982, Advisory Committee meeting at the OHSAA office
 - The first organizational meeting was held at Upper Arlington High School in Columbus on January 30, 1983; 1:00 p.m.; nearly 40 coaches attended on that snowy day
- ❖ Rod Ebright presided over the meeting and some of the items discussed at the meeting included:
 - The official name of our association and the dues (\$5.00)
 - The purpose and structure of our organization; classification of memberships
 - The association's activities including organization and running of the state clinic, All-Ohio teams, the All-Star Match, milestone awards for coaching records; regulating volleyball statistics; involving the newspaper in printing our information
 - Writing a newsletter to be mailed at various times during the year
 - Having a general state meeting at the coaches' clinic in August
 - The basis for writing the constitution and by-laws of our organization
 - The next meeting date was set for April 24, 1983 at Upper Arlington High School, 1:00 p.m.
- ❖ At the April 24th meeting the constitution and bylaws were accepted and ratified by the paid members of the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association
- ❖ Officers were nominated and voted on with the following results: President, Rod Ebright of Grandview Heights/Sports Imports, Inc.; Vice-President, Chuck Braden of New Knoxville; Secretary -Treasurer, Midge Klingensmith of Upper Arlington; Recording Secretary, Jenny Young of New Lexington; and (Acting) Past-President, Cathy Seipel of River View

- ❖ The August, 1983, clinic would be the last major duty of the Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee to the OHSAA; the transition of power to the OHSVCA occurred and they would begin making recommendations for the betterment of the sport to the OHSAA and conducting the state coaches clinic
- ❖ A general meeting of the OHSVCA was held at the 1983 clinic and Vice-President Chuck Braden was busy presenting the new state poll, meeting with coaches that wanted to vote in the poll; and presenting the procedure for the selection of players for All-Ohio; President Rod Ebright presented the constitution and bylaws, the beginnings of the newsletter, and the procedure for the first All-Star match to be held at Grandview Heights on Sunday, November 20th, at 3:00 p.m.
- ❖ By August, many of the sixteen districts that make up the OHSVCA, had been formed and selected a person to be their district director to the OHSVCA; district directors had the voting power in the OHSVCA
- ❖ The first state poll occurred September 13, 1983; final one was in November
- ❖ Brief overview of the significant decisions/happenings for 1983 in the OHSVCA:
 - Formation of District Associations
 - The Top Twenty Rankings, All-Ohio selections, the All-Star Match
 - Coaches awards (coach of the year and coaches achievement awards)
 - The newsletter
 - Volleyball Hotline (also known as the Code-a-phone)
 - Newspapers providing more coverage; attendance improving during the regular season and the OHSAA tournaments
 - Greater representation to determine concerns about rules and regulations
- ❖ Numbers in the association by June of 1983: 80

A BRIEF REVIEW OF THE YEAR OF 1984

- ❖ Officers: President- Rod Ebright, Grandview Heights; Vice-President- Chuck Braden, New Knoxville; Recording Secretary- Jenny Young, New Lexington/Medina; Secretary Treasurer- Midge Klingensmith, Upper Arlington (later in the year replaced by Time Zerull, Granville, due to resignation of Midge); (Acting) Past-President- Cathy Seipel, River View
- ❖ District Directors: District 1- Bill Dorazio, West Farmington; District 2- no representative; District 3 - Carol Russo, Elyria; District 4 - Carolyn Vickers – Loudonville; District 5 – Lorna Miller, West Holmes; District 6 – Pam Bechtol, Oak Harbor; District 7 – Sonny Lewis, Holland Springfield; District 8 – LuAnn Youngpeter, Spencerville; District 9 – Wade Wilhelm, Fairlawn; District 10 – Patty Pease, Fairbanks; District 11 – Melinda Schnorrenberg, Hebron Lakewood; District 12 – Rod Johnson, Buckeye Trail; District 13 – Chuck Dorsey, Jackson; District 14 – Karen Mount, Washington Court House; District 15 – Pam Witzmann, New Lebanon Dixie; District 16 – Rose Koch, Mother of Mercy
- ❖ Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1984 in the OHSVCA:
 - Clinic held in May at Upper Arlington HS; no OHSAA rules interpretation meeting at the clinic because of the date
 - Executive Committee formed
 - Problems with volleyball camps in the summer and fall; guidelines established by the OHSVCA
 - Discussed seeding all teams in the sectional tournaments, extending the season, and permitting more names on the pass list for tournaments
 - Discussed & had committees related to coaches milestone awards (certificates for 100 & 200 wins, plaque for 300 wins), scholarships (one \$100.00 award), joining the National High School Athletic Coaches Association, paying mileage to all board members, honorary awards, and establishing a Hall of Fame
 - Discussed sponsors for the OHSVCA
 - UPI news service carried the OHSVCA Poll
 - Opinion Survey included in the October Newsletter; used to be the basis for much of the action/proposals taken by the OHSVCA Board of Directors; proposals had to be on the agenda for the November meeting in order to be discussed

- Some of the issues addressed in the survey were independent play (House Bill 296), rule changes, four-class system, boys' volleyball
- Tim Zerull of Granville took over as treasurer in November; balance of \$2990.00 in our account
- Improvements/suggestions for the polls, All-Ohio Players & Coaches Selections, & the All-Star Match, Volleyball Hotline
- All-Star Matches held at Denison University in Granville, November 19, 1984
- Attendance at the 1984 OHSAA State Volleyball Tournament was the best ever since the tournament started in 1975; the OHSAA Volleyball State Tournament deficit was the lowest since 1975; the OHSVCA had been in existence for two years

 - Coaches were selected from the statewide All-Ohio balloting; the top two vote getters for Coach of the Year in each division were asked to participate in the All-Star Matches; if a coach was unable to participate, the person receiving the next highest amount of votes was tapped
 - Officials and line judges for the day included: Glenn Purdy, Cindy Saling, Darlene Mooris, Gary Fettrow, Mary Katferer, JoAnne Guisinger, Diane Thompson, Ron Wintermutte, and Beth Thomson

- The volleyball uprights and officials' platform were donated for the day by Sports Imports, Inc.

 - 9:30 a.m. - coaches and players meet at the Field House
 - 10:00 – 12:00 – practice sessions for the teams
 - 1:00 p.m. – Class 'A' match
 - 2:30 p.m. – Class 'AA' match

A BRIEF REVIEW OF THE YEAR OF 1985

 - Clinic held in June at Upper Arlington HS; held in conjunction with AAU-USBVA Juniors tournament on Saturday & Sunday; no OHSAA rules interpretation meeting at the clinic because of the date; membership included in the price of the clinic; lifetime membership available for \$50.00; exhibitors paid for areas; clipboards & calendars, clinic evaluation were included in the packet to coaches; door prizes given

- ❖ Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1987 in the OHSVCA:
 - April, 1987, showed a membership of 457 with 9 lifetime members
 - Goal was set to have 500 coaches in attendance at the State Coaches Clinic in June
 - April, 1987, was the fifth newsletter for the 1986-87 year; broken down as followed: September issue- district news, membership info, list of officers & district directors, coaches voting in the poll, info about the winner of the OHSVCA Scholarship, article concerning boys volleyball, info about the OHSAA state tourney, & college articles; October issue- announcement concerning the All-Star Match, district news, former high school players playing in college, & an article on videotaping; December- articles about the state tournament, final poll selections, All-Ohio selections, All-Star Matches, & Coaches Achievement Awards; March issue- newly formed Junior High Advisory Board, Junior Olympic info, recommendations for the National Federation & OHSAA rules,

- application for the OHSVCA scholarship, minutes of the OHSVCA Board meeting, & information concerning a new volleyball rules film;
- OHSVCA suggested the following to the OHSAA to be effective for 1987: to go to a four class system, that officials be divided into crews of four; that officials allow players to warm-up during the 3 minutes between games (was a rule, just not always interpreted correctly); rule book packets be mailed directly to the coaches instead of the principals; officials names in the state tournament program; the OHSVCA be permitted to take out an ad announcing the State All-Star Match; recommended 8 districts as opposed to 6; recommended 4 divisions instead of 3 classes; continued interpretation of the Olympic Development rule
 - OHSVCA suggested the following to the National Federation to be effective for 1987: to allow hair devices with the small metal clasp; to not penalize a team twice for simultaneous violations
 - Discussions & committees related to coaches milestone awards (certificates for 100 wins, plaque for 200 & 300 wins), scholarships (one \$100.00 award); Lifetime Achievement Award to be given at All-Star Match in 1988; considering Scholastic Achievement Award for athletes; constitution needs re-vamped & need new job descriptions for positions; Final Four Pins ordered for the teams participating at the state tournament, beginning in 1988; Gweynn Hampel of Rocky River, Trudy DeRoma of Parma Holy Name, & Jane Ramsay of Avon Lake presented their information on keeping volleyball statistics for teams in Ohio
 - Clinic held in June at Upper Arlington HS (pre-registration-\$40); registration was 280; no OHSAA rules interpretation meeting at the clinic because of the date; membership included in the price of the clinic; membership included discounts to various motels, car rentals, professional sports, & amusement parks; lifetime membership available for \$50.00; exhibitors paid for areas; clipboards & calendars, clinic evaluation were included in the packet to coaches; door prizes given; Dee Billhardt informed us volleyball would be 4 divisions in 1990; would promote a “Say No to Drugs” slogan & articles for 1987; must increase cost of clinic to increase OHSVCA financial base; mileage payments for officers & directors was voted out
 - Third OHSVCA \$100.00 Scholarship awarded to Cathy Horstman of New Knoxville HS; must be son or daughter of one of the coaching members in the OHSVCA

- By September, the OHSVCA had \$3672.67 in the account, 25 lifetime members & 420 overall members; October newsletter reported 460 members & 31 lifetime members & December newsletter reported a balance of \$2378.87 after the All-Star Matches
- UPI news service once again carried the OHSVCA Poll; need scores reported in the news media
- State Volleyball tournament held for the second year at the University of Dayton
- Improvements/suggestions for the polls, All-Ohio Players & Coaches Selections, & the All-Star Match; Choice Care from the Cincy-Dayton area expressed an interest to sponsor the matches; only 44% of the volleyball coaches in Ohio voted for officials
- All-Star Matches held at Otterbein College, Westerville, November 22nd, 1987; retiring Past-President Rod Ebright presented with a plaque for his service to the OHSVCA
- In December, President Grace Hutchinson sent a letter to OHSAA Commissioner Richard Armstrong with concerns about the OHSAA volleyball tournaments, including playing all semi-finals on Friday and all finals on Saturday
- 1987 NCAA Volleyball Championships held at Purdue University

- ❖ Brief overview of the significant discussions/decisions/happenings for 1988 in the OHSVCA:
 - Girls’ classification for the 1988-89 school year: Class A: 8 – 151 (268 schools); Class AA: 152 – 316 (268 schools); Class AAA: 317 – 1251 (270 schools)
 - March newsletter carried the following information: balance in our funds were \$1236.80; the first boys state volleyball tournament (in association with the OHSVCA) was to be held May 21 at New Knoxville HS; the first Lifetime Achievement Award and Final Four Pins were to be given to the teams & coaches qualifying for the state tournament at the All-Star Match; coaches could submit the names of junior & senior players that earned a 3.500 GPA or higher on the form provided to receive the Scholastic Achievement Award (over 120 players would receive this award in the first year)
 - New membership brochure was designed to include won-loss records of coach
 - Businesses or groups could purchase ads to be placed in the newsletters
 - Archbold won the first boys state tournament held at New Knoxville HS (nine teams)

- Junior High coaches were to become eligible for the milestone awards (certificates for 100 wins, plaque for 200 & 300 wins, etc)
- Clinic held June 17-18 at Upper Arlington HS; over 500 in attendance; pre-registration fee was \$45.00; Drill Book, Volume 2 was presented (thanks to Dave Pallenik & Barry Stebbins); no OHSAA rules interpretation meeting at the clinic because of the date; membership included in the price of the clinic; lifetime membership available for \$50.00; clipboards given at the clinic with the handouts; exhibitors paid for areas; clinic evaluation were included in the packet to coaches; door prizes given; clinic fee waived for the officers, district directors, & jr. high board due to their duties & responsibilities with the clinic, but must still pay membership
- Mikasa became a sponsor for the All- Star match
- September newsletter reported a balance of \$11,859.21 in our treasure, 530 members including 61 lifetime members
- The fourth year of OHSVCA \$100.00 Scholarships were awarded to Jill Drummond of Class A Kyger Creek HS; Holly Everhart of Class AA Springfield Northwestern HS; and Cindy Parrish of Lake HS; must be a player of one of the coaching members in the OHSVCA

- There were 158 winners of the individual scholastic award
 - Middle School name would be added to the Junior High Advisory Board; new paid position of Awards/Poll Secretary
 - Norwalk won the second boys state tournament held at Franklin Heights HS (20 teams)
 - Final membership for 1988 was 625 with 65 lifetime members
 - OHSAA Board of Control voted the following to be effective for 1989: teams WOULD change benches with each game; officials must have the coin toss prior to the 20 minute warm-up; volleyball would have 4 divisions in 1990; NO to the following: jr. varsity & varsity coin toss at the same time,; 3 out of 5 games, individual awards at regionals
 - Clinic held June 16-17 at Upper Arlington HS; Deborah Moore was announced as the new Assistant Commissioner to the OHSAA; pre-registration was \$45.00; new wireless mike was used; over 400 in attendance; Drill Book, Volume 3 was put together by Barry Stebbins; no OHSAA rules interpretation meeting at the clinic because of the date; carrying case provided in cost of the clinic; sports medicine available; scrimmage board made available; door prizes given; sale of items left over from past clinics (i.e.- clipboards, Drill Books, etc); college credit available; the following were honored with plaques: Tim Zerull- past treasurer Radonna Miller- coordination of clinic at UA, Dave Pallenik & Barry Stebbins- drill book; new job descriptions & restructuring of the OHSVCA (officers- president, clinic vice-president, All-Star Matches vice-president, treasurer, recording secretary (officers would be elected 2 year term, even/odd years); paid positions of executive secretary & awards/poll secretary; district directors, junior high/middle school advisory committee, boys volleyball advisory committee;
 - OHSVCA would need to decide their commitment to boys volleyball

THE STATE VOLLEYBALL COACHES CLINICS: 1984 – 1989

- ❖ The Girls' Volleyball Advisory Committee of the OHSAA organized and conducted the state volleyball clinics from 1973 to 1983
- ❖ The state rules interpretation meeting and a lunch were provided at the early clinics and have continued as a part of the clinics (if the clinic was in August/September)
- ❖ The clinic was a one day event from 1973 to 1979; in 1980, the format changed to a two day clinic to accommodate the need for more information and the different level of coaches in attendance
- ❖ In 1977, the state championship coaches were asked to speak at the clinic
- ❖ *The Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association have organized and conducted the state coaches clinics for volleyball since 1984*
- ❖ The state volleyball coaches clinics has been one of the most well attended of the sport clinics in Ohio for the thirty years of its existence

1984 – MAY 4TH & MAY 5TH (Friday and Saturday)

The clinic was being held in cooperation with the OHSAA, the OHSVCA, the Department of Athletics of Upper Arlington High School, and Sports Imports, Inc.; the clinic once again offered two different levels of instruction for coaches based upon their experience in coaching; Head clinicians were Carol Dewey, head volleyball coach of Purdue University, and Mike Hebert, head volleyball coach of the University of Illinois; cost of the clinic (advanced registration) was \$20.00 and was to be sent to Jenny Young, recording secretary of the OHSVCA; a general session of the OHSVCA was held at the clinic and included the election of a new secretary-treasurer; this clinic did not include a rules interpretation meeting due to the date in May

1985 – JUNE 21ST & 22ND

The clinic returned to Upper Arlington High School, but the date was moved to June to accommodate more coaches (many could not be released from school in May, or were coaching a spring sport); making his first appearance in Ohio was the head clinician Chuck Erbe, head coach at the University of Southern California; guest clinicians included OSU's head volleyball coach Jim Stone & assistant coach Ernie Gilbert, and the state championship coaches; election of a new vice-president would occur at the general session (Grace Hutchinson) and Chuck Braden took over as the president with Rod Ebright

moving to the past –president’s position; advanced registration was \$18.00; again there was no rules interpretation meeting due to the time of the year

1986 – JUNE 13TH & 14TH

Chris Voelz, head volleyball coach from the University of Oregon, was the main speaker; other speakers included Dr. James Reardon, psychologist from Grant Sports Medicine Clinic, University of Cincinnati head coach Mike Lingenfelter, & Frank Fritensky, Eastern Michigan University head coach; state championship high school coaches spoke and several other high school and junior high school coaches spoke; this clinic included door prizes, exhibits, and a sports medicine clinic for the first time; advance registration was \$30.00 for the clinic at Upper Arlington HS

1987 – JUNE 19TH & 20TH

This clinic was once again held at Upper Arlington High School; Kathy DeBoer (University of Kentucky) was the featured speaker, and Don Shondell (Ball State) was the guest speaker; goal was to get 500 coaches to the clinic- we didn’t (past clinics had pulled in 300 – 350 coaches); the new drill book was introduced to the membership based upon drills received from coaches the previous year; Sonny Lewis was elected as the new vice-president & Grace Hutchinson took over as our third president;

1988 – JUNE 17TH & 18TH

The clinic was once again held at Upper Arlington High School and the main speakers were Patty Dowdell, head coach of DePauw University, Kathy DeBoer, head coach of the University of Kentucky, Mike Lingenfelter, head coach of the University of Cincinnati, and the head athletic trainer from Centerville High School, Lori Flegle Mayo; sessions in sports medicine and junior high coaching were included; the second drill book was part of the handout materials; we did get 500 coaches to the clinic!

1989 – JUNE 16TH & 17TH

The \$45.00 clinic fee included admission to the clinic at Upper Arlington HS, exhibits, Saturday lunch, carrying case, door prizes, and OHSVCA membership, pin, card, 3rd volume of the drill book, clinic handouts, and mailings of the OHSVCA newsletters; main speakers were Marlene Piper (head coach of University of California, Davis) and Sue Woodstra (head coach of the University of Pittsburgh, former captain of the 1984 USA women’s Olympic team); featured speakers were Marci French (Baldwin-

Wallace College) and Peg Huffman (Capital University); successful Ohio high school coaches also spoke at some of the sessions

THE OHSAA VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENTS: 1984 - 1989

A FEW BRIEF FACTS

- ✓ All schools were/are eligible for the OHSAA Volleyball tournaments as long as they were in good standing with the OHSAA
- ✓ Girls classification for the 1984 – 1985 school year was as follows: Class A: 0 – 153 (269 schools); Class AA: 154 – 321 (268 schools); Class AAA: 322 – 1191 (268 schools); total of 805 member schools; based on October, 1983, enrollment in upper three grades
- ✓ Advancement through the tournament trail was/is as follows: the sectional tournament, the district tournament, the regional tournament (also called the “Sweet Sixteen”); and the state tournament (Final Four)
- ✓ The tournaments are all single elimination tournaments
- ✓ Seeding for the top teams occurs only at the Sectional level
- ✓ The sectional and district tournaments are conducted by the six district boards in the state (Central, Eastern, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, and Southwest); the regional and state tournaments are under control of the OHSAA
- ✓ Teams were allowed to dress twelve academically eligible players for the tournaments; those twelve could change throughout the tournament as long as they were academically eligible
- ✓ *The first state tournament ticket cost \$2.00, the program .50 cents (1975); in 1983 and 1984 the programs cost \$1.00, but the cost increased in 1985 to \$1.50 and stayed at that price through 1989*
- ✓ The 1984 state tournament was the last one to be held at Otterbein College, as the attendance had outgrown the Rike Center; Dr. Jo Ann Tyler had been in charge of the first nine tournaments; in 1985, the tournament moved to the The Ohio State University, St. John Arena for one year with Dr. Phyllis Bailey the tournament manager
- ✓ After 1985, the tournament moved to the University of Dayton with Dr. Elaine Dreidame acting as the tournament manager; the tournament was held at UD through 1990
- ✓ *In 1981, the state volleyball tournament started on Friday night with one class only playing their semi-final matches that night; this had been recommended for several years by the Girls’ Volleyball Advisory Committee, but the OHSAA was slow to change the format to two days due to the lack of revenue being produced; this format continued through 1987*
- ✓ **In 1988, all semi-finals were played on Friday and all finals were played on Saturday**

- ✓ The semi-finals on Friday started at 12:30 & 2:00 pm for Class “AA”; the semi-finals for Class “AAA” were at 4:00 and 5:30 pm; and the semi-finals for Class “A” were at 7:30 & 9:00 pm
- ✓ The finals were as follows: Class “AA” at noon, Class “AAA” at 2:00 pm, and Class “A” at 4:00 pm
- ✓ In 1989, there was a change in times for the semi-finals: Class “AAA” was played at noon & 1:45 pm, Class “A” was played at 3:45 & 5:30 pm, & Class “AA” was played at 7:30 & 9:15 pm
- ✓ The finals also changed their times to the following: Class “AAA” was played at noon, Class “A” was played at 2:30 pm, and Class “AA” was played at 5:00 pm
- ✓ Another change would arrive in 1990 – the state was moving to four divisions in volleyball! Classes had served the OHSAA volleyball tournaments from 1975 through 1989

**A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE MAJOR
RULES AND REGULATIONS IN VOLLEYBALL 1984 – 1989**
(National Federation Rules and the Ohio High School Athletic Association)

- In 1974, the state of Ohio switched from the DGWS Rulebook for Volleyball to the National Federation of State High School Associations edition of volleyball rules
- The rules of the National Federation will be indicated with a **checkmark** and come from the front of each of the rulebooks to indicate major rule changes for that year
- Rules and regulations of the OHSAA will be indicated with an **arrow**
- *In 1984-1985, the case book became a part of the mailing to the officials*
- In 1984, the Publicity Chairman for Ohio was Hank Zaborniak, Jr. He was in charge of spreading information pertaining to officials and the officiating program in Ohio to the entire nation
- Rules interpreters were Dolores Billhardt and Clair Muscaro from 1984 through 1988
- In September of 1988, Dolores “Dee” Billhardt died as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident
- In 1989, Debbie Moore was named to replace Ms. Billhardt; she and Clair Muscaro were the rules interpreters for 1989

1984: Bonnie Northcutt was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, comments on the rules, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 68

- ✓ Specifies the score of a game forfeited after the start of the shall reflect the points scored by the offending team and 15 points, or sufficient number to reflect a 2-point advantage, for the winning team
- ✓ Indicates that all obstructions, regardless of attachment, over a playable surface are in play. Obstructions over a non-playable surface are out-of-bounds
- ✓ Specifies that it is recommended the standards (including cranks), cables and referee’s stand be padded with a minimum of 1” soft, flexible material
- ✓ Indicates teams shall occupy the bench located on the side of the net adjacent to their playing area throughout the game

- ✓ States at the time of the serve, the center forward shall not be as near either sideline as adjacent front line players; center back shall not be as near either sideline as adjacent back line players; no back line player shall be as near the center line as the corresponding front line player
- ✓ Specifies a back line player shall not return a ball which is completely above the top of the net
- ✓ Allows a served ball to be blocked before it has crossed the net
- ✓ Specifies it is a net foul for a player to grasp the floor or wall cables, standards or referee stand for support. Incidental contact is not penalized
- ✓ States if a coach's request for substitution is recognized, then the coach withdraws the request, the substitute does not have to enter the game, but unnecessary delay is called
- ✓ Defines the penalty for unnecessary delay, either prior to or during the game, as the assessment of a time-out with the team being given the 60 seconds. If the team has already used its 2 time-outs, point or side-out will be awarded
- ✓ Redefines illegal substitution as a substitute entering the game without official's recognition of the request, in the wrong position, or a fourth time; reentering during the same time-out or being an unlisted substitute
- ✓ Defines "improper substitution procedure" as occurring when the players involved do not stand in the proper location, do not give their numbers to the umpire, enter or leave the court before told to, or giving the wrong numbers or reversing the numbers
- ✓ Specifies that if incidents of improper substitution become excessive unnecessary delay is called
- ✓ Allows a team to use their time-outs prior to the start of the game
- ✓ Developed a new signal for illegal alignment, illegal hit or serve, side-out, intentional screen, end of game and unnecessary delay

In 1984 – 85, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Player may participate in no more than 3 games per common opponent per junior varsity and varsity matches
- Recommended that the referee for a varsity match be a registered official; required in 1985
- Recommended that all schools use the uniform warm-up procedure during the regular season of 4-6-6-4
- Coaching and instruction could begin 4 weeks prior to Labor Day
- *Scrimmages for junior high and freshmen teams were denied*

1985: Bonnie Northcutt was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules and the same items as 1984, but was 64 pages long

- ✓ Specifies that a match which is suspended due to power failure or unforeseen circumstances may be resumed from the point of suspension unless the State Association determines otherwise. If resumed, the score and lineup shall be the same as it was at the moment of suspension
- ✓ Defines adjacent courts which are scheduled for play as nonplayable surfaces
- ✓ Specifies a 1/8 – 3/16 inch steel cable through the top and a 1/8 – 3/16 inch diameter flexible steel cable or ¼ rope through the bottom of the net
- ✓ Recommends for 1985-86 (required beginning in 1986-87) that:
 - a. standards be padded to a minimum height of 5' 6" with at least 1" thick soft, flexible material (such as polyethylene foam) to encase the uprights and all tensioning devices
 - b. front and sides of the referee's platform be protected in the same manner as the standards
 - c. any guy cables or rigid braces be padded to a minimum of 5' 6" with at least ½" thick soft, flexible material
- ✓ Specifies the height of the net as 7' 4 1/8" for girls and 7' 11 5/8" for boys as measured at the center of the net. The net measured at the ends cannot exceed that height by more than ¾"
- ✓ Specifies that supports are permitted except on the elbows, hands, fingers, wrists or forearms as long as they are soft and yielding or are padded with at least ½" foam rubber
- ✓ Defines screening as an act, intentional or unintentional, which obstructs the opponents view of the server or the flight of the ball from the server
- ✓ Specifies a replay is called when a player serves the ball before the referee's signal unless, in the judgment of the referee, it was intentional in which case it is an illegal serve
- ✓ Specifies that nonplaying team members, including coaches and managers must remain seated on the designated bench during the game
- ✓ Indicates that dangerous contact with floor/wall cables, standards or referee's platform is illegal and penalized by point of side-out
- ✓ Specifies that a ball which has gone under the net and is completely on the opponent's side of the net is a dead ball
- ✓ Indicates that a replay shall be called for unintentionally serving the ball before the referee's signal and for a double whistle on the serve
- ✓ No longer requires the coach to specify how many substitutions he/she wants to make

- ✓ Specifies that a previously injured player who has been replaced by a player who has played in another position or is entering for the fourth time because all team members have played in another position shall not reenter during the rest of that **game**
- ✓ Specifies that the coaches shall remain seated on the bench during the game except, among other situations, when conferring with players during time-outs

In 1985 – 86, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Officials must attend one State conducted Rules Interpretation meeting per year
- The designation of different levels of officials changed from “Registered” to a “Class 1” official and from a “Temporary” to a “Class 2” official
- The referee of a varsity match was to be a Class 1 official and the umpire could be a Class 1 or 2
- High school volleyball teams were permitted 22 contests in the regular season and seven scrimmages or six scrimmages and a preview for the entire season; freshmen teams and junior high school teams were NOT permitted any scrimmages
- According to a survey by the National Federation, volleyball was the third most popular sport played interscholastically in the United States

1986: Bonnie Northcutt was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules and the same items as 1985, and was 64 pages long

- ✓ Should an official interfere with a player’s legitimate effort to play the ball, a replay shall be called
- ✓ Padding on standards, floor/wall cables and referee’s stand is now required
- ✓ Permits a ¼” closed cell, slow recovery foam rubber padding on supports and artificial limbs which are not soft and yielding
- ✓ The specifications for numbers on the uniforms is now required
- ✓ Specifies that a player(s) whose uniform is not legal because of a duplicate number or lack of a number shall not enter the game until the number is made legal. There is no other penalty assessed unless there is unnecessary delay
- ✓ Deletes description of specific screening guidelines, leaving it to the judgment of the referee as to whether or not a member of the receiving team’s view of the server or flight of the served ball has been blocked by member(s) of the serving team
- ✓ Specifies that the ball is whistled dead when a player enters a nonplayable area

- ✓ Multiple contacts on a single attempt to receive a hard-driven spike are now legal provided the ball has not been touched by a teammate
- ✓ Specifies that when a starting player is injured during warm-ups, a substitution shall be made without penalty and it shall not count as an entry for the injured player

In 1986 – 87, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- In January & February, Commissioner Richard Armstrong sent out urgent information to clarify OHSAA Bylaw 10-2-6- participation in Olympic Development programs (JOs) to all member schools
- The head coach, assistant coach or athletic director as well as officials had to attend one state rules interpretation meeting each year in the sport
- The Handbook for Officials underwent a dramatic revision and was now considered the “rule book” for the officials

1987: Bonnie Northcutt was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, and the same items as 1985, and was 64 pages long

- ✓ Permits the modification of the length and number of games in invitational, state playoffs, and/or subvarsity matches
- ✓ Permits courts to be 18 meters long and 9 meters wide
- ✓ Specifies that when the host school does not pad the standards, floor/wall cables and referee’s platform according to rule 3-1-3, the match shall not be played, and the state association shall be notified
- ✓ Specifies that when a player or entire team has illegal uniforms (other than duplicate numbers, lack of numbers or shoes), one penalty is assessed the team for the match
- ✓ Specifies that officials wear solid white or black athletic shoes and socks
- ✓ Specifies that when a team’s player enters the game for the third time, the umpire shall notify the coach of the third entry
- ✓ Permits the umpire to time time-outs and intervals between games in non-timed games
- ✓ Permits, by State Association adoption, team benches to remain the same throughout the match
- ✓ Adds the definition of a dink/tip/dump. It is a fingertip play in which the ball is directed into the opponents’ court
- ✓ Defines a simultaneous foul as when a team violates more than one rule during a single play, or dead ball

- ✓ Specifies penalties for simultaneous fouls as: 1) during a single play or live ball, one penalty is assessed; 2) during a dead ball, all penalties are assessed
- ✓ Defines the penalties for a double foul during a dead ball, the penalty is assessed the serving team, then the receiving team
- ✓ Specifies that a player who has already been in the game 3 times is the last player that can be used in abnormal substitution situations
- ✓ Permits, by State Association adoption, the use of yellow and red cards in warning and penalizing unsportsmanlike conduct

In 1987 – 88, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- In volleyball, no game is subject to forfeiture unless the contest has started
- It is permissible to have a coach-official conference to rectify a correctible error; this does not apply to judgment calls

1988: Bonnie Northcutt was the chairwoman; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, comments on major rule revisions, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 64

- ✓ Specifies backboards hanging in a vertical position over a playable area are out-of-bounds unless, in the judgment of the official, the ball would have remained in if the backboard had not been there
- ✓ Permits aramid-type fiber cable no more than ¼” thick which is no heavier, has no more stretch and has at least as much tensile strength as the required steel cable through the top of the net
- ✓ Requires permanent numbers on the uniform shirt
- ✓ No longer permits officials to wear skirts or culottes
- ✓ Specifies the umpire’s position during the game as standing outside the sideline boundary
- ✓ Specifies that the umpire shall repeat the referee’s signals for violations
- ✓ Permits the umpire to warn, penalize or disqualify players, coaches or other team personnel for misconduct fouls
- ✓ Specifies the umpire may inform the team requesting a time-out how many time-outs it has used
- ✓ Specifies lineups shall be submitted to the scorer at least 2 minutes prior to the first game
- ✓ Requires the official scorer to print the referee’s and umpire’s names on the scoresheet

- ✓ Specifies written team rosters and lineups shall remain at the officials' table throughout the match
- ✓ No longer permits a serve with both hands or a bounce serve, and eliminates the penalty for a swing and miss if the ball is then served within 5 seconds
- ✓ Defines an illegal serve and service fault
- ✓ Specifies penalties for illegal serve and service fault situations
- ✓ On a first team hit, permits multiple contacts by a player making a single attempt to save a hard-driven spike without setting action
- ✓ Defines a spike as an attack play in which the ball is forcibly hit into the opponent's court with a one-hand, overhead motion
- ✓ Specifies substitution requests, except for injury, prior to the game are denied
- ✓ Specifies no liquid or powder substance is permitted on the court
- ✓ Renames signals 1, 2, 5, 6, and 8 and adds signals for backline attacker, backline blocker and a new signal for screening

1989: Becky Oakes was the chair; rulebook consisted of twelve rules, comments on major rule revisions, points of emphasis, instructions for the scorekeeper, scoresheet, line-up sheet, officials signals, approved volleyballs, National Federation videos and publications, and the index to rules; number of pages- 64

- ✓ Permits a 2 inch or a 4 inch line
- ✓ Requires all hard, unyielding protective devices worn on body parts other than fingers, hands or arms to be covered
- ✓ Eliminates specific requirements for padding of approved artificial limbs
- ✓ Prohibits players from wearing undergarments or tights which extend below the uniform shorts without written medical authorization
- ✓ Specifies that undershirts, if worn, shall be plain and of like-color to the uniform shirt
- ✓ Prohibits the use of any replay or television monitoring equipment to make decisions relating to the game
- ✓ Specifies that the position of a player's foot is used to determine overlapping
- ✓ Specifies that a member of a block must contact the ball near the top of the net for a block to have occurred
- ✓ Permits lineup changes prior to the start of a game in the case of injury or illness
- ✓ Specifies the penalty for illegal substitution as unnecessary delay

- ✓ In the case of an injured player, the coach must decide within the 30 seconds to: 1) replace the injured player; 2) leave the player in and play begins immediately; or (3) take a team time-out
- ✓ Defines as unsportsmanlike conduct a team using television monitoring or replay equipment for coaching purposes during the game or any intermission

In 1989 – 90, the following information dealt with officials and teams in Ohio:

- Friendship bracelets are considered jewelry and must be removed
- The OHSVCA proposed that officials be required to hold the captain's meeting prior to the starting of the clock for the warm-up period. This proposal was adopted and presented in both the 1989 volleyball bulletins and at the state rules interpretation meetings
